

Donating Building Materials to Boston Building Resources

Donating high-quality building materials, new or used, helps people repair and improve their homes while also sparing the environment from needless waste. Materials We Do Take

For the kitchen

- Cabinets
- Countertops
- Sinks and faucets
- Appliances (in showroom condition, less than five years old)

For the bathroom

- Vanities
- Sinks and faucets
- Tubs and enclosures
- Low-flow toilets
- Ceramic tile
- Accessories (towel racks, etc.)

Windows (no lead paint please)

- Vinyl and wood replacement
- Insulated double hung units
- Awning and hopper windows

Doors (no lead paint please)

- Interior (minimum width 30")
- Exterior
- Storm doors (with frame and hardware)
- Hardware (locks, knobs, hinges)

Lumber, plywood, drywall

- Dimensional lumber (6' minimum length, no scraps)
- Moldings
- Plywood (half sheets or larger)
- Drywall (half sheets or larger)
- Exterior house shutters (wood, no lead paint)

Flooring

- Carpeting and carpet tiles
- Ceramic and vinyl tile
- Sheet vinyl
- Wood

Electrical (working and complete)

- Residential surface-mounted light fixtures
- Paddle fans

Paint

- Latex paint, full containers
- Cans must be clean and paint in good condition

Materials We Don't Take

Door types

- Doors with lead paint
- Storm doors without frame, screen, or glass
- Sliding patio doors unless in excellent condition with wood interior and clad exterior
- Used bi-fold doors
- Hollow-core doors
- Used shower doors
- Cabinet doors without the cabinets

Window types

- Storm windows
- Casement or fixed windows
- Any sash without its frame
- Single-pane wood sashes
- Picture windows larger than 24 sq. ft.

Plumbing

- Used cast iron tubs
- Toilets that are not low-flow
- Used pipes (cast iron, PVC already glued)
- Steam radiators
- Wall-mount sinks

Electrical

- Commercial electrical equipment
- Commercial light fixtures that don't have residential application
- Recessed lighting ("cans")
- Appliances
- Appliances not in excellent working condition
- Appliances not in "showroom" condition
- Any appliance that is five years old or older
- Used wall ovens without their cabinets

Paint

- Partial cans or paint in poor condition
- Boston residents can consider giving other containers of paint to the city's paint swap shops

Other

- Acoustic ceiling tiles
- Countertops that are worn, stained, or dated
- Kitchen cabinets too old to be reused
- Furniture (consider donating residential furniture to the Massachusetts Coalition for the Homeless and office furniture to The Furniture Trust.)
- Office equipment
- Recreational and exercise equipment
- Fill—clean or otherwise
- Glass of any kind (e.g., storefront, plate, jalousie, mirrors)
- Concrete masonry units or bricks unless they are delivered to us (must be clean and free of mortar)
- Used chain link fencing
