Town Clerk

Chair: Committee Chair Eric Helmuth reported that he and

John Leone met earlier that day with Town Clerk

Stephanie Lucarelli and members of her staff.

He said that the Clerk had no objections in principle to changing the methods of voting to include electronic voting, though she wanted to be sure that her office was not given new responsibilities without the means

to carry them out.

According to Mr. Helmuth, the Clerk told him and Mr. Leone that said that the law requires her office to keep paper. Consequently, she said, she would keep paper records produced by the electronic-voting system.

Mr. Helmuth reported that the Clerk offered to ask other town clerks to how they are handling recordskeeping in light of electronic voting.

He noted that some issues related to retention of data might be discussed with David Good, Arlington's Chief Technology Officer, who plans to attend the Committee's January 2 meeting.

Mr. Helmuth said the Clerk's staff expressed enthusiasm for electronic voting.

New Business

Costs and Benefits of Electronic Voting

Adam Auster led a discussion of the costs and benefits of different possible implementations of electronic voting.

The Committee considered the implications of the following possible implementations:

- quick tally in which only totals are reported,
- quick tally in which the roll-call results are reported only the next day or later,
- electronic roll call with no publication or retention of results,
- electronic roll call with results published.

The Committee compared these with the current voting methods (voice, standing, and traditional roll call) that they might replace, against such costs and benefits as time, accountability, cost, accuracy, curatorial burden, and potential for fraud or error.

MOTION: Request for Information Raymond Charbonneau moved to appoint Steve Storch, Elizabeth Patton, and himself to a subcommittee to work on a request for information to vendors.
