Receipt and Authorization to Negotiate: Responses to RFP for Space at Parmenter School 6. Adam W. Chapdelaine, Town Manager

The Town Manager asked approval from the Board of Selectmen to negotiate final leases with the International School of Boston and Arlington Children's Center for the respective spaces in the Parmenter School Building. Once he comes to an agreement with each party, the Manager

will bring the agreed upon leases back to the Board for final approval. Mr. Chapdelaine stated both bids came in above the minimum price per square foot agreed upon in the RFP and both have asked for some minor changes to the leases.

Study, Economic Impact of Arlington's Theatres 7.

Carol Kowalski, Director, Planning & Community Development

An extensive report compiled by analysts Cambridge Economic Research concluded the two

Theaters (Regent Theatre and Capital Theater) have a significant positive impact on their respective business districts in the Town. Mr. Greeley, Mrs. Mahon and Mr. Byrne questioned the Planning Department's decision to conduct a \$10,000 study.

They feel that most people in Town already know they are important to the Town and we did not need to spend that kind of money. Mrs. Mahon commented that the Friends of the Drama were not included in the study and asked why the Planning Dept. with the expertise of the Economic Development Planner did not conduct the study themselves which would have save the Town on the consulting fees. Mr. Byrne stated he wished more criticism of current policy was included in the study.

Mr. Dunn and Mr. Curro stated that they feel the study would be useful. Mr. Curro stated the data in the study shows the growth in the arts, entertainment and recreation sector of the local economy since 2001 and feels it will be a useful tool in promoting that area of town life. Mr. Dunn stated he feels the study would help Selectmen make the case for tough decisions which benefit businesses but might inconvenience some residents.

Mr. Greeley moved receipt of report.

8. For Approval: Lowell Street Signs Elisabeth Carr-Jones and Jeff Maxtutis, TAC Working Group Leads Howard Muise and Richard Turcotte, TAC Co-Chairs

The Board voted to approve the TAC recommendation of installing regulatory warning signs on Lowell Street from West Court Terrace to the Lexington Line, as well as advance pavement markings and "crosswalk ahead" signs at Westmoreland and West Court Terrace crosswalks. Officer Corey Rateau, Traffic and Parking Unit

On December 12the a resident of Bow Street asked the Town Manager if something could be done on Bow Street where several cars have had their mirrors damaged by passing cars. The

Board asked that his letter be referred to the Police Department for review and recommendations.

The Arlington Police Department's Traffic and Parking Unit recommended that the two-way road was too narrow for legal on-street parking and recommended that signs be erected to reflect "No Parking" on both sides of Bow Street.

Human Rights Commission Response Coordination Team

done.
