

Arlington Massachusetts Avenue Reconstruction Project

Hydrant Removals and Resetting – Nighttime Work

MassDOT is in the process of reconstructing Massachusetts Avenue in Arlington. Late last fall and into the early winter of 2014, MassDOT's contractor for the project, J.H. Lynch was in the process of removing and resetting hydrants along Massachusetts Avenue. This operation was suspended due to weather and is now resuming.

The relocation of fire hydrants requires excavations in Massachusetts Avenue to access underground piping and shutting down water services as such must take place at night to limit inconvenience to the business and property owners. Night work will begin on **Sunday, May 3rd, and continue to Friday, May 8th**. Hydrant work will occur at the following locations:

- Sunday, May 3rd – intersection of Massachusetts Avenue and Cleveland Street
- Monday, May 4th – intersection of Massachusetts Avenue and Lake Street
- Tuesday, May 5th – intersection of Massachusetts Avenue and Egerton Road
- Wednesday, May 6th – 240 and 230 Massachusetts Avenue
- Thursday, May 7th – 288 and 72 Massachusetts Avenue
- Friday, May 8th – contingency night

Certain properties will have water service suspended in the late night/early morning hours on the listed nights. If your water service will be affected by a shutdown, ***you will receive a separate notice***. Water service will resume no later than 5:00AM. Again, any impacted property will receive additional notification from the Town of Arlington's Water Department.
