TOWN OF ARLINGTON  
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**2012 ROAD REHABILITATION PROJECTS**  
**Updated: August 21, 2012**

As part of the Town’s ongoing 2012 Capital Improvement Program, the Department of Public Works is coordinating the rehabilitation of various roads throughout Town. Through the Town’s paving contractor; D & R Paving, various streets are being resurfaced and improved. Work consists of road milling, leveling, casting adjustments, and re-surfacing. Additional work includes crack sealing, infrared patching and curb installation. Work began in mid-May and will last throughout the 2012 construction season. The following list indicates the street location and the estimated start date for the projects. These dates are subject to change due to weather conditions and scheduling changes. During this time residents in these areas should expect some on-street parking restrictions to allow for construction activities and equipment. The contractor will make every effort to keep inconveniences to a minimum and traffic police details will be present to aid in driveway access/egress and roadway safety. Residents are requested to observe on-street roadway postings and detour signs. Traffic message boards will be used to aid traffic management efforts. Residents traveling through these areas should plan accordingly, allow for travel delays, and should consider alternative routes when possible.
