This work is being performed to improve accessibility to and along the streets of Arlington and includes the installation of ADA compliant ramps, detectable warning panels, level landings and transition areas to the existing sidewalks. It is anticipated that work will be completed this Summer.

As work progresses at additional locations, informational flyers will be placed at abutting homes notifying residents of the upcoming work and detailing the anticipated impacts. During the times of construction activity residents should expect some on-street parking restrictions to allow for construction activities & equipment. The contractor will make every effort to keep inconveniences to a minimum and traffic police details will be present to aid in driveway access/egress and roadway safety. Residents are requested to observe on-street roadway postings and detour signs to aid traffic management efforts. Residents traveling through these areas should plan accordingly, allow for travel delays and should consider alternative routes when possible.
