

VISION 2020 FISCAL RESOURCES TASK GROUP Meeting Minutes 7:30 PM 12/17/15 Senior Center First Floor Conference Room

ATTENDEES: Gordon Jamieson (Co-Chair), David Garbarino (Co-Chair), Brian Hasbrouck, Heather Remoff, Pete Howard (Secretary)

OPEB FUND/CRB MEMBERSHIP: Gordon reviewed the membership and responsibility of the Contributory Retirement Board (CRB). Teachers are not part of the Town's retirement plan. They do, however, participate in the Town's post retirement health insurance plan. Eventually, this plan will be funded by OPEB to which the Town makes a modest annual appropriation. The CRB manages this fund but the teachers are not represented. After some discussion, the group again agreed that a letter is desirable (or perhaps we will raise this issue with the Comptroller when we meet with him in 2016).

TRASH COLLECTION FOR NON-PROFITS: Gordon discussed this with the Town Counsel, Doug Heim. Doug said he would look into it. Pete expressed concern with this initiative. After some discussion, Gordon said he would clarify his request to Heim to emphasize the desirability of providing uniform service to all buildings (Done). Gordon also asked Doug to look into enforcing the commercial PAYT program. As things stand, only if trash not collected for any reason (including containing recyclable material) and left on the curb overnight, is a bylaw violated. It then falls to the Health Department to enforce the bylaw. This does not work. Doug said he would look into this too.

ANNUAL BoS TAX RATE HEARING: Gordon and Brian attended. Gordon reported that the BoA report was more complete than in some previous years (Ref 2). Gordon and Brian felt that FRTG's involvement has had a positive effect.

COMMERCIAL ASSESSMENTS: The FRTG wondered what effect the commercial reassessment had. Brian had selected 46 commercial properties and listed their 2015 and 2016 assessments. Pete plotted the % increase (Ref 1). For this sample, the increases were mostly between 5% and 10%. Brian thinks this sample is too small to be conclusive. He will try to get the total numbers for this type of property for 2015 and 2016, perhaps from the BoA report to BoS or from the DOR.

FRTG GOALS: Not discussed due to lack of time.

Winter 2016 V2020 Library Display: FRTG asked to provide something short/inviting for display.

MTG W/ NEW COMPTROLLER: Gordon said the comptroller made a good report (Ref 3) to the BoS in November. FRTG to invite him to a meeting in early 2016 (Jan/Feb).

COMMITTEE REGULARIZATION: Gordon also discussed this topic with Doug Heim. Heim will determine whether the Long Range Planning Committee needs to post minutes to conform with the open meeting law. The letter discussed at the last meeting will not be needed.

FINCOM & CPC MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL: Not discussed due to time.
