I INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

1. Receipt of Bids

The Town may consider informal any bid not prepared and submitted in accordance with the provisions hereof and may waive any informality in or reject any bids. Any bid may be withdrawn before the time for the opening of bids. Any bid received after the time and date specified shall not be considered. No bidder may withdraw his/her bid for a period of 30 days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays after actual date of the opening thereof.

2. Preparation of Bid

Each bid shall be submitted on the forms attached to these documents. The bid forms may be removed and submitted separately from the other documents. All blank spaces for bid prices must be filled in with the unit price for the item or the lump sum for which the proposal is made. Bidders must bid on each item. All entries in the entire proposal must be made clearly, and prices written in both words and figures in the spaces provided.

Each bid must be in a sealed envelope addressed to the Office of the Purchasing Agent, 730 Massachusetts Avenue, Arlington, Massachusetts, 02476; and bearing on the outside the name of the bidder, his/her address, the name of the project for which the bid is submitted, and the notation ' **BID # 16-09 CHIPSEALING ROADWAYS/MT. PLEASANT CEMETERY**

3. Bid Security

Every bid submitted by contractors shall be accompanied by a bid deposit in the form of cash, certified check, treasurer's or cashier's check, or a bid bond issued by a responsible bank or trust company and made payable to the Town of Arlington. The amount of the bid deposit shall be 5% of the amount of the bid. All security except those of the three lowest responsible and eligible bidders will be returned within ten days, Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded, after opening of the bid. All bid securities will be returned on the execution of the contract or if no award is made within 30 days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, after the actual date of the opening thereof, unless forfeited under the conditions herein stipulated.

In case a party to whom a contract is awarded shall fail or neglect to execute the contract and furnish the satisfactory bond in the time specified, the Town may determine the bidder has abandoned the contract and thereupon the proposal and acceptance shall be null and void, and the bid security accompanying the proposal shall be forfeited to the Town as liquidation damages for such failure or neglect and indemnify the Town for any loss which may be sustained by failure of the bidder to execute the contract and furnish the bonds as aforesaid, provided that, in case of death, disability, or other unforeseen circumstances affecting the bidder, such bid security may be returned to him/her.

After execution of the contract and acceptance of the bonds by the Town, the bid security accompanying the proposal of the successful bidder will be returned.

4. Time of Completion

The bidder must agree to commence work within five (5) business days from the date of signing the contract and to fully complete the project within the time specified within the Special Provisions section of this document.

5. Performance and Labor Material Bonds

A performance bond in the sum of 50% of the total amount of the Contract by the successful bidder and an additional bond in equal amount covering the payment for all labor and materials used in the work will be required. A surety company authorized to do business in Massachusetts and satisfactory to the Town of Arlington must provide these bonds. These bonds will be required at the execution of the contract. Attorneys-in-fact who sign contract bonds must file with each bond a certified and effectively dated copy of their power of attorney.

6. Laws and Regulations

The bidder's attention is directed to the fact that all applicable State laws, Town of Arlington Bylaws, municipal ordinances, and the rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over construction of the project shall apply to the contract throughout, and they shall be deemed to be included in the contract the same as though herein written out in full.

7. Withdrawal of Bids

Upon proper written request and identification, Bids may be withdrawn only as follows:

- a. At any time before the designated time for the opening of Bids.
- b. Death or serious injury of a principal.
- c. With the written approval of the Town of Arlington Office of the Purchasing Director.
- d. At any time after the expiration of the period during which withdrawal is prohibited provided the bid has not been accepted by the Town.

8. Execution of Contract

The party to whom the contract is awarded shall be required to execute the contract and furnish the bonds duly executed with a satisfactory surety company within five days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, of the date of the mailing of the notice to the bidder according to the address given by him/her, that the contract is ready for execution.

9. Obligation of Bidder

At the time of the opening of bids, each bidder shall be presumed to have read and to be thoroughly familiar with the contract documents. The failure or omission of any bidder to receive or examine any form, instrument, or documents shall in no way relieve any bidder from the obligation in respect to his bid.

10. Omissions, Discrepancies, Interpretations and Addenda

Should a bidder find discrepancies in, or omissions from, the drawings or contract documents, or should he/she have questions as to the interpretation of the plans or contract documents he/she shall submit such in writing to the Director of Purchasing at least five (5) days before the date herein set for the opening of bids. An interpretation will be mailed by certified mail to prospective bidders at the addresses given by them on or about two (2) days before the opening of bids. Signed copies of all addenda shall be included with the bid; omission of the signed addendum shall be cause for rejection of the bid.

11. Record of Address

Prospective bidders shall at the time plans and specifications are secured place on file with the Director of Purchasing their address, and are required to make any changes necessary to insure that the record is accurate, complete, and up to date.

12. Massachusetts Sales and Use Tax

Materials purchased for permanent installation in the work will be exempt from the Massachusetts Sales and Use tax. Each bidder shall consider this exemption in calculating his/her bid for the work.

13. State Tax Affidavit

Prospective bidders are required to certify that all state tax returns have been filed and all state taxes have been paid in order to be eligible to enter into a contract with the Town on this project. The included form is to be used for this purpose and is to be completed and returned as part of the bid and proposal.

14. Minimum Wage Rates

Prevailing rates for wages for work performed under this Contract will be as predetermined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in accordance with the provisions of Sections 26 to 27D, inclusive, of c.149 of M.G.L. A schedule of the prevailing wages is included in the Minimum Wage Rates Section.

15. Sub-bids

No sub bids shall be sought in connection with this Contract.

- 16. All bidders shall submit the following supplemental information with a fee proposal:
- a. Name, address and phone number of a minimum of three (3) references that can vouch for the performance of the bidder
- b. Proof of Liability and Worker's Compensation Insurance Coverage
- c. Completed tax attestation form
- d. Bid deposit

II LOCATION OF WORK

1. Work under this contract includes all labor and materials to perform Chipsealing Roadways/Mt. Pleasant Cemetery.

III PROPOSAL

To the Town of Arlington, Massachusetts, herein called the TOWN, acting through its Town Manager; the undersigned, as bidder, declares as follows:

- a. The only persons or parties interested in this proposal as Principals are named in this proposal;
- b. This proposal is made without collusion with any other Person, firm or corporation;
- c. He has carefully examined the requirements of the proposed work;
- d. This proposal is based solely on his own investigation and research and not in reliance upon any survey, report or representations of any employee, officer or agent of the TOWN; and the undersigned proposes and agrees that if this proposal is accepted, he will contract with the TOWN, this Contract Bid Form being part of and included in said CONTRACT, to provide all necessary supervision, labor, equipment, machinery, tools, apparatus, and other means of service necessary to complete the requirements in the CONTRACT; and that he will take in full payment thereof the following sums to wit:

Bidders must bid on each item. All entries in the Contract Bid Form must be made clearly and in ink, and prices must be written in both words and figures in the space provided. Bidders should insert computed totals in the spaces provided therein:

SPECIFICATIONS FOR CHIP SEAL

1.0 DEFINITIONS

The term Director [Superintendent, etc.] shall mean the Director of Public Works of the awarding authority.

The term Designee shall mean an employee of the awarding authority, designated by the Director.

The term Contractor shall mean a professional company contracted by the awarding authority to perform work under this agreement.

2.0 DESCRIPTION

Work under this contract shall consist of the Contractor furnishing and applying liquid asphalt and cover aggregate on properly prepared bituminous streets. Bid quantities are approximate only; payment shall be for actual quantities applied to streets. Streets to be stone sealed shall be selected by the Contractor and the Director or his/her Designee.

3.0 MATERIALS

3.1 <u>Liquid Asphalt:</u>

Liquid asphalt grades shall be: CRS-2L, CRS-2P, RS-2L (2% Latex), or MC-3000 conforming to AASHTO specifications M316, M140 or M82.

3.2 Latex Additive:

The latex additive shall be Butonal NX 1129 (Anionic) or Butonal NX 4190 (Cationic) or equivalent conforming to the following specifications. It is required that the latex be co-milled at the bulk emulsion facility, to ensure complete and balanced blending. The emulsion manufacturing plant must be open to inspection by the awarding authority.

3.3 Cover Aggregate:

Cover Aggregate shall be crushed stone, free from dust, soft stone or other contaminants, with a minimum of 90% of the stones have a fractured face. All stone shall satisfy a 35% maximum for the L.A. Abrasion Test and a 35% maximum for the Flakiness Index Test. Aggregate shall meet the following gradation as tested by AASHTO T27.

^{*}Pre-treatment of the stone is required if the percentage passing of 0.075 mm (#200) is greater than 1.0%. Proper pre-treatment shall be obtained by a twin shafted Pugmill with a Digital Readout Belt Scale. The stone shall be treated with a diluted slow setting emulsion at the rate of 1-2 gallons per ton to ensure uniform treatment of all aggregate.

4.0 MATERIAL QUANTITIES

The quantity of asphalt emulsion to be used shall be in the range of 0.35 to 0.50 gallons per square yard, or the quantity of MC-3000 to be used shall be in the range of 0.25 to 0.35 gallons per square yard. Cover aggregate shall be spread in the range of 20 to 30 pounds per square yard. The Contractor will use lab tests to design specific material quantities to meet existing field conditions. Variations in material quantities will be made without adjustment to contract unit price. The Contractor must maintain a laboratory open to the inspection of the awarding agency.

5.0 EQUIPMENT

The equipment used by the Contractor shall include, but not be limited to, one or more of the following:

5.1 Asphalt Distributor:

The asphalt distributor shall contain suitable mechanical circulating and heating mechanisms to provide a uniform approved temperature of the entire mass of material. The distributor shall be equipped with a radar type sensor used to measure ground speed, and feed a Digital Volumetric Accumulator capable of measuring liters applied and distance traveled. It shall be capable of applying asphalt material in accurately measured quantities at any rate between 0.1 to 2.0 gallons per square yard, of roadway surface, at any length of spray bar up to 16 feet. The distributor shall be capable of maintaining a uniform rate of distribution of asphalt material regardless of change in grade, width or direction of the road. It shall be equipped with an electronic control for setting asphalt pump discharge rate and on/off switching of spray for nozzles in one (1) foot, increments which shall be located in the truck cab. The spray nozzles

and pressure system shall provide a sufficient and uniform fan-shaped spray of asphalt material throughout the entire length of the spray bar at all times while operating. The spray shall completely cover the roadway surface receiving the treatment.

5.2 Aggregate Spreader:

The aggregate spreader shall be hydrostatically driven and self-propelled. It shall be equipped with a hydraulically controlled variable adjustable head that is capable of spreading stone in widths from 4.5 to 18 feet. The spreader shall be mounted on pneumatic tires and shall apply the treated stone on the road surface in a manner that ensures that the tires do not contact the road surface until after the stone has been applied. The unit shall be equipped with an electronic radar type sensor used to measure ground speed and will automatically adjust the stone application rate depending on width of application and the speed of chip spreader. It shall have the ability to apply stone on any grade from 0 - 6%. The spreader shall be equipped with an integral hopper with a minimum capacity of 5 tons, of treated stone which shall be filled by trucks in a manner which ensures that the truck tires never come in contact with asphalt-treated road surfaces until the stone has been properly applied. To maintain constant stone application, a self-locking truck hitch will permit towing of aggregate trucks without stopping the chip spreader. It will capable of maintaining positive engagement over irregular terrain.

5.3 Rollers:

A minimum of two (2) rollers, with at least one (1) pneumatic tire roller, shall be used on each treated surface immediately after the stone has been applied. Each roller shall have a compacting width of not less than 5 feet and a gross weight of not less than 7 tons.

5.4 Trucks:

Rear discharge conveyor-fed trucks in sufficient number and size must be used to deliver aggregate to the spreader.

6.0 CONSTRUCTION PROCEDURES

6.1 Streets to be Treated:

The Contractor and the Director shall mutually determine the streets which shall receive chip seal treatment. Measurements of streets to be treated shall be made by the Contractor and the Director or his/her Designee, and the Contractor shall prepare a cost estimate for each street prior to beginning work.

6.2 <u>Surface Preparation:</u>

Surface preparation, which may include crack sealing, pothole patching, truing and leveling, adjusting of street irons (valve covers, manhole covers, drop inlet gratings), etc., will be the responsibility of the awarding authority and will be completed before the contractor moves onto the job.

The contractor shall thoroughly clean the surface by sweeping immediately prior to application of the chip seal and be responsible for covering all utility irons just prior to application and uncovering after aggregate is spread.

6.3 Weather Limitations:

No work shall be completed during rainy conditions. The ambient temperature must be 50°F and rising.

6.4 Aggregate Storage:

The awarding authority shall be responsible for providing the Contractor with an aggregate storage area near the job site.

6.5 <u>Asphalt and Aggregate Application:</u>

The liquid asphalt and aggregate shall be applied at the material quantities as designated in Section 4. The liquid asphalt shall not be applied more than 300 feet in advance of the self-propelled aggregate spreader.

6.6 Rolling:

Initial rolling shall be done immediately following the application of aggregate. A minimum of three (3) passes should be completed over the entire treated area. Rollers shall be operated at a speed that will not displace aggregate.

6.7 Traffic Control:

Traffic control is the sole responsibility of the awarding authority. Unless otherwise specified, the roadway shall be kept open to traffic at all times, with traffic discontinued on the lane being surface treated. Controlled traffic may be permitted as soon as the final layer is applied and rolled. A recommended maximum speed of 20 mph, should be maintained for a period of two (2) hours.

6.8 Sweeping:

Surplus aggregate shall be swept off of the road surfaces by the contractor. Sweeping shall be done after chip seal has properly cured, and care will be taken not to dislodge imbedded aggregate or damage the surface.

The awarding authority shall provide a place for the disposal of material removed by sweeping.

Additional follow-up post-sweeping at a later date is the responsibility of the awarding authority unless bid as a separate bid item.

7.0 PERFORMANCE

The awarding authority will not award this contract unless the Contractor furnished satisfactory evidence of his/her ability and experience to perform this work, and that he/she has sufficient capital and equipment to enable him/her to prosecute the work successfully and to complete it within the time named in the contract. The Contractor shall not sublet any portion of this contract, and will own all equipment used to complete such contract. As part of the bid, the Contractor must submit a list of six similar and successfully completed jobs, whose relevance to the proposed job shall be deemed by the awarding authority. The name, address, and telephone number of a contact person involved with each of these projects must be included so they can be investigated prior to the award of the contract. It will be the responsibility of each

bidder to visit the job site with the Director. The awarding authority can reject any bid of a contractor who has not visited the work site.

8.0 METHOD OF MEASUREMENT AND BASIS OF PAYMENT

Payment for work under this agreement shall be made at the contract unit price per square yard times the number of square yards, measured by the Contractor and the Director or his/her designee, of road surface treated. Price per square yard shall be for complete in place quantities. Upon completion of work, and acceptance by the Director, the Contractor shall submit a payment request to the Director. Payment shall be net thirty (30) days.

9.0 GUARANTEE

Any material or workmanship found to be defective for up to one (1) year from the date of acceptance by the Director shall be replaced by the Contractor at no cost to the awarding authority. Upon notification of defective material or workmanship, the Contractor shall immediately replace such defective areas.

PRICE ADJUSTEMENT

A fluctuating price will be required for this bid to allow for price adjustments based on the period price of asphalt cement in the awarding authority's state. The price adjustment will be based on the variance in price for the asphalt cement component only from the Base Price to the Period Price. Base price for this bid will be \$______ per ton of asphalt cement.

"Base Price" = the price of PG binder liquid per ton that exists on the bid opening date, listed above.

"Period Price" = the price of PG binder liquid per ton on the date the stabilization work is performed.

Chip Seal:

Current Price minus Base Price divide by 238 (Gal. in ton emulsion) x .66 (asphalt in Gal. emulsion) x .42 Gal. / SY (application rate) = Adjustment per square yard.

It shall have the ability to apply stone on any grade from 0 - 6%. The spreader shall be equipped with an integral hopper with a minimum capacity of 5 tons, of treated stone which shall be filled by trucks in a manner which ensures that the truck tires never come in contact with asphalt-treated road surfaces until the stone has been properly applied. To maintain constant stone application, a self-locking truck hitch will permit towing of aggregate trucks without stopping the chip spreader. It will capable of maintaining positive engagement over irregular terrain.

5.3 Rollers:

A minimum of two (2) rollers, with at least one (1) pneumatic tire roller, shall be used on each treated surface immediately after the stone has been applied. Each roller shall have a compacting width of not less than 5 feet and a gross weight of not less than 7 tons.

5.4 Trucks:

Rear discharge conveyor-fed trucks in sufficient number and size must be used to deliver aggregate to the spreader.

6.0 CONSTRUCTION PROCEDURES

6.1 Streets to be Treated:

The Contractor and the Director shall mutually determine the streets which shall receive double chip seal treatment. Measurements of streets to be treated shall be made by the Contractor and the Director or his/her Designee, and the Contractor shall prepare a cost estimate for each street prior to beginning work.

6.2 <u>Surface Preparation:</u>

Surface preparation, which may include crack sealing, pothole patching, truing and leveling, adjusting of street irons (valve covers, manhole covers, drop inlet gratings), etc., will be the responsibility of the awarding authority and will be completed before the contractor moves onto the job.

The contractor shall thoroughly clean the surface by sweeping immediately prior to application of the chip seal and be responsible for covering all utility irons just prior to application and uncovering after aggregate is spread.

6.3 Weather Limitations:

No work shall be completed during rainy conditions. The ambient temperature must be 50°F and rising.

6.4 Aggregate Storage:

The awarding authority shall be responsible for providing the Contractor with an aggregate storage area near the job site.

6.5 Asphalt and Aggregate Application:

The liquid asphalt and aggregate shall be applied at the material quantities as designated in Section 4. The liquid asphalt shall not be applied more than 300 feet in advance of the self-propelled aggregate spreader.

6.6 Rolling:

Initial rolling shall be done immediately following the application of aggregate. A minimum of three (3) passes should be completed over the entire treated area. Rollers shall be operated at a speed that will not displace aggregate.

6.7 <u>Traffic Control:</u>

Traffic control is the sole responsibility of the awarding authority. Unless otherwise specified, the roadway shall be kept open to traffic at all times, with traffic discontinued on the lane being surface treated. Controlled traffic may be permitted as soon as the final layer is applied and rolled. A recommended maximum speed of 20 mph, should be maintained for a period of two (2) hours.

6.8 Sweeping:

Surplus aggregate shall be swept off of the road surfaces by the contractor. Sweeping shall be done after chip seal has properly cured, and care will be taken not to dislodge imbedded aggregate or damage the surface.

The awarding authority shall provide a place for the disposal of material removed by sweeping.

Additional follow-up post-sweeping at a later date is the responsibility of the awarding authority unless bid as a separate bid item.

7.0 PERFORMANCE

The awarding authority will not award this contract unless the Contractor furnished satisfactory evidence of his/her ability and experience to perform this work, and that he/she has sufficient capital and equipment to enable him/her to prosecute the work successfully and to complete it within the time named in the contract. The Contractor shall not sublet any portion of this contract, and will own all equipment used to complete such contract. As part of the bid, the Contractor must submit a list of six similar and successfully completed jobs, whose relevance to

the proposed job shall be deemed by the awarding authority. The name, address, and telephone number of a contact person involved with each of these projects must be included so they can be investigated prior to the award of the contract. It will be the responsibility of each bidder to visit the job site with the Director. The awarding authority can reject any bid of a contractor who has not visited the work site.

8.0 METHOD OF MEASUREMENT AND BASIS OF PAYMENT

Payment for work under this agreement shall be made at the contract unit price per square yard times the number of square yards, measured by the Contractor and the Director or his/her designee, of road surface treated. Price per square yard shall be for complete in place quantities. Upon completion of work, and acceptance by the Director, the Contractor shall submit a payment request to the Director. Payment shall be net thirty (30) days.

9.0 GUARANTEE

Any material or workmanship found to be defective for up to one (1) year from the date of acceptance by the Director shall be replaced by the Contractor at no cost to the awarding authority. Upon notification of defective material or workmanship, the Contractor shall immediately replace such defective areas.

PRICE ADJUSTEMENT

A fluctuating price will be required for this bid to allow for price adjustments based on the period price of asphalt cement in the awarding authority's state. The price adjustment will be based on the variance in price for the asphalt cement component only from the Base Price to the Period Price. Base price for this bid will be \$______ per ton of asphalt cement.

"Base Price" = the price of PG binder liquid per ton that exists on the bid opening date, listed above.

"Period Price" = the price of PG binder liquid per ton on the date the stabilization work is performed.

DESCRIPTION AND SPECIAL CONDITIONS

SINGLE and DOUBLE

CHIPSEALING ROADWAYS IN MOUNT PLEASANT CEMETERY

DESCRIPTION

This section pertains to Chip Sealing roadways in Mt Pleasant Cemetery, Arlington MA.

The Single Chip Seal shall include the furnishing, application, and compaction of a latex modified emulsified asphalt binder and a crushed stone cover according to the Specifications contained in this Contract.

The Double Chip Seal shall include the furnishing, application, and compaction of a latex modified emulsified asphalt binder and a crushed stone cover applied in two courses according to the Specifications contained in this Contract.

GENERAL

All work shall meet the 1988 MassDOT Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges and the Supplemental Specifications, unless otherwise noted.

WORK SCHEDULE

Attention is called to the fact that work under this Contract must be completed by <u>May 20, 2016.</u> Work is restricted to a normal eight hour day, five day week. No work shall be done on Saturdays, Sundays, or holidays, or on the day before or the day after a long weekend which involves a holiday without written approval from the Town.

SCOPE OF WORK

The work under this Contract consists of furnishing all necessary labor, materials, equipment, and services to complete Chip Sealing to roadways located in Mt Pleasant Cemetery. Work shall include mobilization, pre-sweeping, post sweeping, and protection of all manholes, catch basins, water gate boxes, or other castings.

DIRECTION AND OVERSIGHT OF WORK

The Contractor shall provide a qualified Supervisor for the duration of the Project. The Supervisor shall schedule, direct, and oversee the Project, and shall be solely responsible for the methods, techniques,

sequences and procedures. The Engineer will provide general administration of the Contract, and will be the Town's representative during construction. All communication between the Contractor and the Town shall be between the Supervisor and the Engineer.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

Note: Attention is called to the fact that Mt Pleasant Cemetery is an active cemetery. All work shall be coordinated and scheduled with the Cemetery Supervisor. There may be times when work may need to be temporarily suspended or shifted to a different section due to interments. The Cemetery Supervisor shall have the authority to suspend or shift operations. <u>No extra or additional compensation will be allowed for any delays resulting from Cemetery operations.</u>

Note: Attention is called to the fact that the Cemetery is divided into two sections, separated by a bridge. At no time shall any heavy equipment or trucks cross this bridge. There are entrances to both sections for access, and work shall be coordinated relative to this condition.

All equipment and materials shall be stored in approved areas. Approved areas shall be determined by the Cemetery Supervisor. At no time shall any equipment or materials be stored or placed on any graves or grass areas. Any areas disturbed due to construction shall be promptly swept or repaired and left in a condition to the satisfaction of the Cemetery Supervisor at the end of every workday. All roadways shall be open for safe travel at the end of every workday.

Construction signs, barrels, and cones as required shall be supplied, installed, and removed by the Contractor.

All material swept prior to the chip sealing, and following the chip sealing, shall become the property of the Contractor, and shall be legally disposed of by him. No separate payment will be made for the sweeping or for the disposal of material swept.

Police Detail, if required, shall be scheduled by the Contractor and paid by the Town. If Police Detail is scheduled and work is cancelled by weather or any other reason, it shall be the Contractor's responsibility to cancel the Police Detail at a minimum of one hour prior to scheduled start time. Failure to do so will result in the Contractor paying the Detail.

Single Chip seal will be measured for payment by the square yard of pavement surface area complete in place.
