## **Bethany Eisenberg LEED AP**

Bethany Eisenberg LEED AP, is the Corporate Director of Stormwater Services in the Land Engineering Department at Vanasse Hangen Brustlin Inc. in Watertown Massachusetts. Ms. Eisenberg has more than 25 years experience in hydrology, hydraulics, stormwater management and currently specializes in low impact design (LID) site engineering, flood control, and green streets/green highway sustainable stormwater design. She has served on the Massachusetts Stormwater Advisory Committee for more than 20 years and assisted with the development of the regulations released in 2008. She is currently the Chairman of the ASCE Permeable Pavement Technical Committee that is preparing a Guidance document for the design, installation and maintenance of permeable pavements. She attended the University of Vermont, University of Rhode Island and Northeastern University.

### Session 2 Summary – Low Impact Development

Stormwater Management - Low Impact Development in Practice - Changing Practices for Planning, Landscape Architectural Design, and Stormwater Infrastructure Engineering

National trends for greener construction and more comprehensive stormwater quality management are resulting in changes in regulations and stormwater management across the nation. Massachusetts has recently experienced significant changes in stormwater regulations with a focus on groundwater

recharge, water quality control and preservation of soils and vegetation. Opportunities for creative landscape architectural design through practices such as porous pavement/pavers, bioretention areas and rainwater recovery are becoming more common on sites across the state. Examples from multiple VHB Low Impact Development projects will be presented and a discussion of how the change towards these low impact development practices can help to protect water quality and flood control in Arlington.

The Arlington Stormwater Series is planning additional sessions throughout 2012. Future session topics will include: Stormwater impacts overview, low impact development (LID), sustainable landscaping, composting, soil amendments, rainwater harvesting, rain gardens, rain barrels, edible landscaping, porous pavement, and much more.
