SESSION 4 – RAIN BARRELS & RAINWATER HARVESTING

The Town of Arlington Engineering Division is hosting a Stormwater Awareness Series open to residents of the Town of Arlington and the general public.

The series is designed to educate residents on Stormwater and the impacts on runoff, water quality, flood control and prevention, erosion and other stormwater related impacts within the Town of Arlington. Suzanne Gebelein is the owner of The Great American Rain Barrel Company. With her husband, they also own a small food importing company located in Hyde Park, where they import specialty Mediterranean Foods in bulk and repack and distribute them across the country. The Great American Rain Barrel Company takes the shipping drums and retrofits them for water collection. They have been selling rain barrels since 1992 and ship barrels all over the United States both to individual homeowners and community/municipal programs for distribution.

Rainwater Capture and Re-Use Systems

Mr. Ottenheimer will discuss various aspects of rainwater capture and re-use. Topics covered will include:

- Why we need to make use of this important resource;
- What systems exist to capture and store rainwater underground for future use;
- What are possible end uses of the captured water;
- What rules govern rainwater capture and re-use and what permits are needed before beginning a project.

Several case studies will also be provided.
