In accordance with 310 CMR 40.1403(3)(e), GZA GeoEnvironmental, Inc., on behalf of Coventry Builders, LLC, is providing this written notice to you that a Phase IV Remedy Implementation Plan (RIP) has been submitted to the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MADEP). Concentrations of PCBs, total lead, polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons, and pesticides in soil, primarily from the upper two feet, exceed the Method 1 S-1 standards and require remediation prior to site redevelopment. The Comprehensive Remedial Action specified in the Phase IV RIP is excavation and off-site disposal of impacted soils at an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)- and MADEP-approved facility. These contaminants have impacted soil and groundwater at the Disposal Site and require remediation. There are no Exceedences of the Upper Concentration Limits in the groundwater. Soil has been significantly impacted by surface releases of waste oil, hydraulic oil, and motor oil. The recommended remedial alternative is excavation and off-site disposal of impacted soil, and bioremediation or chemical oxidation of impacted groundwater. The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection's (MassDEP's) records indicate that Coventry Builders, LLC (hereinafter referred to as "you" or "your") is a Potentially Responsible Party (PRP) for the site named above which is classified Tier II pursuant to 310 CMR 40.0500. As you are aware, the Tier II Classification authorizes you to undertake response actions at the subject site in order to address a release of oil and/or hazardous material. NOTICE OF NONCOMPLIANCE NONCOMPLIANCE SUMMARY

NAME OF ENTITY IN NONCOMPLIANCE: Park Avenue Citgo

LOCATION WHERE NONCOMPLIANCE OCCURRED OR WAS OBSERVED: 19 Park Avenue, Arlington, Massachusetts

DATE WHEN NONCOMPLIANCE WAS OBSERVED: November 15, 1994

DESCRIPTION OF NONCOMPLIANCE AND OF THE REQUIREMENTS NOT COMPLIED WITH:

Personnel from the Department conducted a compliance inspection at Park Avenue Citgo. The following are the observed violations:

HAZARDOUS WASTE

- (1) 310 CMR 30.253(5)(b), (refers to 30.351(8)(a)), (refers to 30.340(1)(b)): The 500-gallon underground tank used to accumulate waste oil was not marked with the required information. The regulation requires that...Each tank or container in which waste oil is being accumulated and each outside container into which smaller containers are packed, shall be clearly marked and labelled throughout the period of accumulation with the following:
 - (1) The words "Hazardous Waste";
 - (2) The words "Waste Oil";
 - (3) The word "Toxic";
 - (4) The date upon which each period of accumulation begins, marked on each tank or container at the time accumulation begins in that tank or container. For underground tanks, marks and labels shall be made on the aboveground portion of the tanks, or in close proximity to the tank.

Marks and labels shall be placed on the sides of each tank or container in such a manner that they are clearly visible for inspection.

(2) 310 CMR 30.253(5)(b), (refers to 30.351(8)(a)), (refers to 30.340(1)(a)1.c.), (refers to 30.685(1)): The 500-gallon underground tank of waste oil was found to be open. The regulation requires...a container holding waste oil shall always be closed during storage, except when waste is being added or removed. In the event that Federal, State or local law or regulation requires a container to be vented, the container shall be vented in a manner that does not present a threat to public health, safety or welfare, or the environment.

(3) 310 CMR 30.253(1)(h)1.(a. through f.): Weekly tank gauging is not being conducted on the 500-gallon underground waste oil tank. The regulation requires that...all generators of waste oil and all generators of used oil fuel may accumulate or store waste oil or used oil fuel in an existing underground tank only if the tank is in compliance with the following provisions:

1. Existing waste oil underground storage tanks shall have weekly tank gauging conducted according to the following requirements:

a. Tank liquid level measurements are taken at the beginning and ending of a period of at least 24 hours during which no liquid is added to or removed from the tank;

b. Level measurements are based on an average of three consecutive stick readings at both the beginning and ending of

the period;

c. The equipment used is capable of measuring the level of waste oil over the full range of the tank's height to the

nearest one-eighth of an inch; and

d. A leak is suspected and subject to the requirements of 527 CMR 9.20 and 310 CMR 30.697 if the variation between beginning and ending measurements exceeds the weekly standards or the standards derived from averaging four consecutive weekly tests. (For example, the averaging shall be done as follows: average weeks 1 - 4, average weeks 5 - 8 etc.). The standards are in the following table:

Nominal Tank Capacity Std.	Weekly Standard	Monthly
	(one test)	(avg. of four tests)
550 gallons or less 551 - 1000 gallons 1001 - 2000 gallons	10 gallons 13 gallons 25 gallons	5 gallons 7 gallons 13 gallons

- e. The beginning and ending measurements, variation and average figures shall be placed in a log and retained until taken out of service in compliance with 527 CMR 9.22. f. Tank liquid level measurements shall not be required if a double walled tank with continuous monitoring is utilized.
- (4) 310 CMR 30.253(1)(h), (4.a. through 4.c.): The underground waste oil tank was installed in 1986. During the inspection, it was noted that the tank was double walled, but had no leak detection devices. The regulation requires...All existing tanks shall be equipped with one of the following methods of continuous leak detection:

a. A double walled tank with an approved interstitial space

monitor required by 527 CMR 9.08.

b. An in-tank monitor installed and maintained by a qualified person in accordance with 527 CMR 9.11(2)(b).

c. Testing or monitoring for vapors within the soil gas of the excavation zone. The vapor monitoring system shall detect releases from any portion of the tank that routinely contains the waste oil, and shall be designed and operated to detect any significant increase in concentration above background of waste oil or tracer compound placed in the tank system.

The following schedule shall be required for the upgrade of leak detection devices on existing underground waste oil tanks:

IF THE TANK WAS INSTALLED LEAK DETECTION REQUIRED BY DEC. 22

- (1) Immediately upon receipt of this Notice, mark the above referenced containers with the required information. Within thirty (30) days of your receipt of this Notice, this office must receive from you written confirmation that this has been done, and will continue to be done.
- (2) Immediately upon receipt of this Notice, close all containers accumulating waste oil, and continue to keep them closed except when waste is being added or removed. Within thirty (30) days of your receipt of this Notice, this office must be in receipt of written confirmation that this has been done, and will continue to be done.
- (3) through (5) Immediately upon receipt of this Notice, bring the above referenced tank(s) into full compliance with weekly testing, annual tightness testing, and leak detection regulations. As an alternative, you may choose to remove the tank(s) from service. Within thirty (30) days of your receipt of this Notice, this office shall be in receipt of written confirmation along with supporting documentation that the tank is in compliance with the referenced regulations, or has been removed from service.

AIR QUALITY

(1) Effective immediately upon receipt of this Notice, Park Avenue Citgo shall only dispense, or allow the dispensing of, motor vehicle fuel at its 19 Park Avenue, Arlington, Massachusetts facility in compliance with Regulation 310 CMR 7.24(6).

(2) Within fourteen (14) days of receipt of this Notice, Park Avenue Citgo, 19 Park Avenue, Arlington, Massachusetts shall submit in writing to this Office a description of all steps it has taken or will take in order to ensure compliance with the above cited Regulation.
