WHY SHOULD MY BUSINESS RECYCLE?

Many customers in Arlington value environmentally friendly businesses, who practice recycling or composting. Becoming a businesses that recycles could generate loyalty and boost your sales. Also, it's easy, and good for our planet, and could save you money in trash fees.

WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED?

- **Metal**, aluminum tins or steel cans
- **Glass** bottles or jars
- **Plastic** bottles or containers
- **Paper/Cardboard** magazines, pizza boxes

WHAT CAN'T BE RECYCLED?

- **Food scraps**
- **Plastic bags** (return to grocery stores)
- **Ceramics**
- **Diapers**
- **Contaminated bottles or food containers** (to-go coffee cups)
- **Clothes** (donate)

3 STEPS TO RECYCLING FOR YOUR BUSINESS

STEP ONE: CONTACT YOUR WASTE HAULER

Simply call your hauler.

Make sure to:

- ~Know the materials you want to recycle and estimate the volume if you can.
- ~Ask how your items need to be prepared for pick up.
- ~Ask about saving money through reduced disposal costs.

Your businesses waste hauler must have a permit to haul trash and recycling from the town of Arlington.

The back of this brochure contains a list of waste haulers that have obtained permits from the town of Arlington.



STEP TWO: COMPLETE A WASTE AUDIT

What is a waste audit?

A waste audit is an assessment of the amount of waste or recycling your business produces. This will help your business determine the amount of materials you will be recycling, and how large the collection containers will have to be. You can conduct a waste audit for free with various permitted haulers, or on your own.

IF YOU'RE LOOKING FOR A HAULER:

Recycling Works (MA), is a helpful site that can find you a waste hauler. Simply go to their website <https://recyclingworksma.com> click on the "Find a Recycler" page, and fill in your businesses information.

STEP THREE: INFORM YOUR STAFF AND CUSTOMER BASE

Once you've established a type of recycling for your workplace (single stream or other), make sure to let your staff know the new policies. You could send out an email, or put up a notice in the break room.

As for customers, let them know the steps your business has taken to be more environmentally friendly.

Make sure to clearly mark your recycling bins, purchasing bins with defined openings or slots is typically very helpful. Many businesses also post signs above recycling bins that tell customers what can be disposed of in them to avoid confusion.
