- 1. I agree to Feed FiDO only the items listed in this agreement
- 2. Added January 2022: I understand that the doors on the container are heavy, metal, and do not stay open by themselves, making them challenging to use for some residents.
- 3. I understand that this pilot program depends on my cooperation with this User Agreement, and that placing the wrong items in the food scrap drop off bins is a <u>risk to the program's success</u>
- 4. This means no plastic bags (except *BioBags* or similarly "BPI-certified" biodegradable bags) or trash of any kind
- 5. There may be times when the container is marked "FiDo is Full, No Collection at this Time" and I will take my food scraps home again. I will also use common sense and not overfill the containers.
