SPECIFICATIONS

Special Provisions

Pricing

Bid Item numbers reference MHD Standard Specifications Numerical Index of Payment Items. Mobilization and safety signage for construction operations shall be considered part of, and should be included as, part of every item.

Bituminous concrete prices shall include all costs associated with producing, delivering, applying and finishing the work, unless otherwise specified.

Tonnages shall be based upon weight slips specific to each load presented to and signed by the "DPW Agent" at the time and site of application. Only automated printed tonnage slips will be accepted.

Quantities measured other than by weight are subject to signed verification of the DPW Agent.

Renting Equipment

Prices for hourly rental of work-related machinery, operator and fuel are called for in anticipation of unforeseen circumstances that may arise necessitating the use of special equipment to work in conjunction with Town forces. Such rentals are not to be included with Unit Bid Prices that total into the Award amount.

Direction and Oversight of the Work

All supervision and direction of the Work, all authorizations of variance from specifications, and all field decisions of the Town shall be communicated to the Contractor by the DPW Agent, also referred to as the "Town".

Miscellaneous Provisions

The Town of Arlington will pay for police traffic safety and fire details that may be required.

The Contractor will make every effort to avoid damaging abutting property. The Contractor will restore such property damaged by his equipment or personnel to its pre-damage condition, or if so determined by the Town, restoration will be done by others at the Contractor's expense.

The "DPW Agent" is the person authorized to act on behalf of the Town in relation to the performance of work subject to this specification. Such person(s) may vary in name and title from day to day, but shall always be whoever is designated by the Public Works department head and made known to the Contractor.

General Work Specifications

Scope of Work

The work under this contract consists of furnishing all necessary labor, materials, equipment and services to perform Bituminous Road Repair by the Infrared Heater Method at Various Locations in the Town of Arlington, as well as all incidental items necessary to complete work described herein.

All materials and work under this contract shall be in conformance with the latest editions of:

- Massachusetts Highway Department's (MHD) Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges, Supplemental Specifications, and Standard Special Provisions
- Construction and Traffic Standard Details
- The Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices
- Massachusetts Highway Department's (MHD) Wheel Chair Ramp Standard
- The American Water Works Association's Standard for the Installation of Ductile-Iron Water Mains and Their Appurtenances
- The Standard Drawings for Signs and Support.

Location of Project

The work to be performed will be located on various streets in the Town of Arlington at the direction of the Engineering Division.

Work Schedule

Work on this project is restricted to a normal 8-hour day, 5-day week, with the Prime Contractor and all Subcontractors working on the same shift.

No work shall be performed or scheduled on Holidays. Work will not be allowed the day before or the day after a long weekend, which included a Holiday, without prior approval by the Engineer.

It is recognized that weather and temperature constraints for this type of work are restricted; therefore the Contractor shall schedule the work to reflect these conditions.

Accessibility

During construction, the Contractor shall maintain at least one 12-foot travel lane during the day and shall open the road up to two-way traffic at the end of the work day. Any traffic police details that may be required of this work are to be ordered by the Contractor, but will be paid for by the Town of Arlington.

The Contractor shall maintain access to all driveways at all times. If access to any driveways cannot be maintained, the Contractor shall notify the Engineer and persons affected, in writing, at least one (I) week in advance of the planned discontinuance.

Reflectorized barrels, construction signing and other devices deemed necessary by the Engineer and/or Traffic Detail Officers shall be utilized to direct traffic safely through the construction zone.

Community Notification, Coordination, and Parking Restrictions

Contractor shall be responsible for posting Notices to residents affected by proposed construction throughout the course of the project. At minimum, Notices will be required for the following: project introduction (type of work, anticipated start of work and duration, etc.); emergency contact information; road closures; utility shutdowns; emergency conditions; and progress updates, as applicable. Additional Notices may be required by the Engineering Division at no additional cost to the Town. Unless otherwise noted or agreed upon in writing, Notices shall be prepared by the Contractor, submitted to the Engineering Division for review and approval, and distributed by the Contractor upon approval by the Engineering Division. In instances where standard notices have already been developed by the Engineering Division, these notices may be provided by the Engineering Division and distributed by the Contractor.

The contractor shall coordinate work plans with all necessary Town Departments (e.g. Water/Sewer Division, Police Department, Fire Department, etc.) and other organizations (e.g. MBTA for road closures with bus routes, MWRA, DigSafe, utility companies, etc.) affected by construction and as directed by the Engineering Division.

The Contractor shall provide emergency contact information for residents, Town departments, and other applicable organizations prior to the start of construction.

The Contractor shall post "No Parking" signs in areas of proposed work a minimum of 48 hours prior to construction as directed by the Engineering Division. The Contractor may obtain standard no parking signs from the Engineering Division upon which they shall clearly note the date and time of restrictions. Should the Contractor decide to use their own signs, they shall first be provided for review and approval by the Engineering Division. The Contractor is responsible for maintaining and replacing signs in place and/or modifying date and time restrictions as necessary.

Sanitary Provisions

The Contractor shall provide adequate sanitary facilities and maintain in a neat and sanitary condition such accommodations for the use of their employees as may be necessary to comply with the requirements of the State Department of Public Health, local health officials, and other authorities having jurisdiction. Every precaution shall be taken to prevent contamination or pollution of the ground at the site, or of any material or equipment which is to be incorporated in or used in the construction of any work under this contract.

Sanitary facilities shall be available when the first employees arrive on the site of the work, shall be properly secluded from public observation, and shall be provided and maintained during the progress of the work in suitable numbers and at such points and in such manner as may be required. Sanitary facilities shall be removed, and the surrounding areas properly cleaned and disinfected, upon completion of the work.

The Contractor shall maintain the sanitary facilities in a satisfactory and sanitary condition at all times and shall enforce their use. The Contractor shall rigorously prohibit the committing of nuisances by employees on the site of the work, on the lands of the Owner, or on adjacent property.

Management of Debris, Refuse, and Garbage

Debris, refuse, and other garbage of any kind shall not be permitted to accumulate at any of the proposed work locations or storage areas. Debris, refuse, scrap, garbage, etc. shall be removed from the project location sites on a daily basis by the Contractor and disposed of in accordance with all Local, State, and Federal regulations. Removal and disposal of all debris, refuse, garbage, etc. shall be completed at the full cost & responsibility of the Contractor. Should the improper handling of debris, refuse, or other garbage result in pest and/or vermin infestations, the Contractor shall provide pest/vermin control services as directed by the Town. Pest/vermin control services shall be provided at no additional cost to the Town.

Clean up

The work site and adjacent areas affected thereby shall at all times present a neat and orderly appearance.

The Contractor must employ at all times during the progress of their work, adequate cleanup measures and safety precautions to prevent injuries to persons or damage to property. The Contractor shall clean up, at least daily, all refuse, rubbish, scrap and surplus material, debris and unneeded construction equipment resulting from the construction operations and sweep the area if necessary or directed by the Engineer.

Suitable materials, equipment, and methods shall be used for such restoration. The restoration of existing property or structures shall be done as promptly as practicable as work progresses and shall not be left until the end of the Contract period.

Where material or debris has washed or flowed into or been placed in existing watercourses, ditches, gutters, drains, pipes structures, or elsewhere during the course of the Contractor's operations, such material or debris shall be entirely removed by the contractor and satisfactorily disposed of during the progress of the work, and the ditches, channels, drains, pipes, structures, etc., shall, upon completion of the work, be left in a clean and neat condition.

Upon written notification by the Engineer, the Contractor shall within 24 hours clean up those areas, which in the Engineer's opinion are in violation of this section and the above referenced sections of the specifications. If in the opinion of the Engineer, the referenced areas are not satisfactorily cleaned up, all other work on the project shall stop until the cleanup is satisfactory.

The Contractor shall restore or replace, when and as directed by the Town, any public or private property damaged by their work, equipment, or employees, to a condition at least equal to that existing immediately prior to the beginning of operations. To this end, the Contractor shall repair as required all necessary highway, driveway, walk, and landscaping work damaged or disrupted during the course of the Contractor's work.

Before acceptance of work by the Owner, the Contractor shall perform a final cleanup to bring the construction site to its original or specified condition. Unless otherwise explicitly directed or permitted in writing, the Contractor shall, as part of this final cleanup, tear down and remove all temporary buildings and structures built by them; shall remove all temporary works, tools, and

machinery or other construction equipment furnished by them; shall remove, acceptably disinfect, and cover all organic matter and material containing organic matter in, under, and around sanitary facilities and other buildings used by them; shall remove all rubbish from any grounds which they have occupied; and shall leave the roads and all parts of the premises and adjacent property affected by their operations in a neat and satisfactory condition. Before acceptance, the Engineer shall approve the condition of the site.

Worksite Dust Control

The worksite shall be kept free of dust and other sediments to the greatest extent practical. In an effort to accomplish this, on a weekly basis at minimum, the entire site shall be swept by a vehiclemounted, mechanical sweeper. Further, on days in which work is completed within any designated resource area, the work area within this buffer zone shall be swept on a daily basis. All sweepings and material collected from these required cleanings shall be properly disposed of at the full cost and responsibility of the Contractor.

Between sweepings, the Contractor shall use calcium chloride as needed to control dust on-site. Calcium chloride shall be applied when ordered by the Engineer and only in areas which will not be adversely affected by the application. Calcium chloride shall be uniformly applied at the rate of 1 ½ pounds per square yard or at any other rate as directed by the Engineer. Application shall be by means of a mechanical spreader or other approved methods. The number and frequency of applications shall be determined by the Engineer. The application of calcium chloride shall not be permitted in designated environmental resource areas or buffer zones without the prior consent of the Town of Arlington Conservation Commission.

Calcium chloride used on-site shall conform to the requirements of AASHTO-M144, Type I or Type II and Specification for Calcium Chloride, ASTM D98. The calcium chloride shall be packaged in moisture proof bags or in airtight drums with the manufacturer, name of product, net weight, and percentage of calcium chloride guaranteed by the manufacturer legibly marked on each container. Calcium chloride failing to meet the requirements of the aforementioned specifications or that which has become caked or sticky in shipment, may be rejected by the Engineer.

Construction Methods And Materials Specifications

1. WORK PROCEDURE

- A. The area to be repaired shall be swept clean to remove all loose and foreign material.
- B. An approved infrared heater shall be placed over the area to be repaired for a sufficient time until a depth of two (2) or more inches of existing pavement hvas been softened. The heater must be capable of producing a true infrared ray with a minimum of convection heat.
- C. Care must be taken to avoid oxidation of the pavement by improper heating techniques. If this condition occurs, the unsuitable material must be discarded.
- D. The softened area shall be scarified and raked to a workable condition.
- E. Surplus material must be removed, or bituminous concrete top added as required to bring the heated area to the desired grade.
- F. Any additional bituminous concrete top needed for the above work shall be obtained from a suitable infrared heated storage unit to keep the asphalt mix at a proper working temperature of 270 to 300 degrees Fahrenheit. The asphalt to be used will be 3/8" top mix or as directed by the Town of Arlington.
- G. After the paving mixture has been properly blended, spread and raked to grade, compaction shall be obtained by use of a power roller of sufficient weight to establish a uniform density comparable to that of adjacent surfaces within the work area. The finished patch shall be level with no depression holding water on any of its surface.
- H. The edges of the rolled area shall be sealed with a specified petroleum emulsion and a diluted specified petroleum emulsion shall be uniformly hand sprayed on the patched area. Mineral filler will then be spread over the entire newly patched area.
- I. The work area shall then be swept of all old and excess material, and left in a neat condition. Traffic shall be kept off the patch area to allow for proper cooling time to prevent damage or distortion of patch.
- J. The petroleum emulsion shall conform to the following specifications:

- (1) Test procedure identical with ASTM D-244 except that distilled water shall be used in place of two percent sodium oleate solution.
- (2) Pumping Stability is determined by charging 450 ml of emulsion into a one-liter beaker and circulating the emulsion through a gear pump having a 1/4" inlet and outlet. The emulsion passes if there is not significant oil separation after circulating ten minutes.
- (3) ASTM D-244 Evaporation Test for percent of residue is modified by heating a 50 gram sample to 149 degrees C until foaming ceases, then cooling immediately and calculating results.
- (4) In the Maltenes Distribution Ratio Test by ASTM Method D-2006-70:

2. SECTION 850 TRAFFIC CONTROLS FOR CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE OPERATIONS

SUBSECTION 850.21 SAFETY CONTROLS FOR CONSTRUCTION OPERATIONS Add the following at the end of this subsection:

Payment for safety controls for construction operations shall be considered incidental to the contract and the costs included in the unit bid price for those items requiring such controls. Item 851 is not included in this contract.

SUBSECTION 850.22 SAFETY SIGNING FOR CONSTRUCTION OPERATIONS

Add the following at the end of this subsection:

Safety Signage for Construction Operations shall be considered incidental to the work and may also include, but is not limited to, the following signs, mounted temporarily on their own posts or stands, as directed by the Engineer, as required for detour work:

The Contractor shall furnish, erect, remove, cover, relocate, and replace if necessary, all signs as directed by the Engineer. All signs shall be removed when no longer required.

Add this new subsection:

SUBSECTION 850.38 TRAFFIC POLICE DETAILS AND FIRE DETAILS

This work consists of scheduling Traffic Police Details when construction operations involve work which is of a nature where the use of a Traffic Police Detail would be required to increase safety of the general public and construction personnel.

This work also consists of scheduling Fire Details when construction operations involve blasting work. A Fire Detail will be required at all times explosives are present on site.

Scheduling of Details is the responsibility of the Contractor.

The Contractor is responsible for canceling Details directly in the event of schedule changes where work no longer requires the use of Details, or cancellations of work for any reason, including weather. A minimum of one hour prior to scheduled time must be required to cancel Detail.

Contractors that cancel scheduled work to which police, flag people or public works personnel are assigned on an additional pay basis are subject to contract back charges.

Police and fire details as required will be paid for directly by the Town of Arlington.

Miscellaneous Conditions

Prosecution of Work and Provisions for Travel

The Contractor shall give notice in writing to the Engineer at least seven days in advance of beginning any work affecting the maintenance of traffic where work affects the street in use by the public.

Before starting any work under this Contract, the Contractor shall submit their schedule of operations as provided herein.

The Contractor must prosecute the work efficiently and with the least possible delay.

The Contractor shall provide safe and convenient means of access to all buildings of property along the line of work at all times, coordinate the scheduling of safety and traffic details with the Arlington Police Department, and provide notification to the Arlington Department of Public Works and direct abutters at least one (1) business day prior to commencement of work adjacent to said abutter property.

Provisions for Access at All Locations

The Contractor shall cooperate with the various utility companies and provide access through a worksite if required for their work in connection with this project.

All permanent and temporary surfaces open for traffic during construction shall be maintained by the Contractor, as directed, in accordance with the provisions of herein.

THE TOWN WILL NOT ACCEPT ANY MATERIALS DELIVERED TO ANY PROJECT IN MOTOR VEHICLES OR SEMI-TRAILER UNITS THAT EXCEED THE LEGAL MAXIMUM GROSS WEIGHT ALLOWED FOR THE PARTICULAR CLASS. AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 19 A OF CHAPTER 90 OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF MASSACHUSETTS.

Maintenance of Traffic

During construction, the Contractor shall maintain two way traffic at all times. The Contractor shall make every effort to maintain access to all drives at all times. If access to any drives cannot be maintained, the Contractor shall notify the Engineer and persons affected, in writing, at least one (1) week in advance of the planned discontinuance. In any case, the access shall not be discontinued for more than two (2) consecutive days without obtaining the written authorization of the Engineer.

A minimum of 24-hours prior to commencing work, the permit applicant shall contact the Town of Arlington Police Department to determine if a Police Safety Detail will be required for the proposed work.

The use of a Police Safety Detail does not eliminate the need for proper warning signs and traffic control devices during the course of construction.

It shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor to provide & employ appropriate construction signage and barriers/cones/etc as needed. All signs and devices shall be in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways and all applicable MassDOT Standards/Requirements.

Additional signage and devices shall be provided and installed as deemed necessary by the Department of Public Works and/or Police Department for the safe and efficient performance of the work and the safety of the traveling public.

During the entire course of work, the applicant and/or owner shall be responsible to properly delineate & protect the job site in accordance with current MUTCD Standards to the full satisfaction of the Arlington Police Department. Failure or inability to provide appropriate devices & signage may result in work being suspended at the discretion of the Town of Arlington.

Reflective barrels, construction signage and other devices deemed necessary by the Engineer shall be utilized to direct vehicular and pedestrian traffic safely through the construction zone. All work left unattended shall be plated or ramped and suitable work safety devices and methods shall be utilized as necessary. All sidewalks and ramps shall be barricaded with reflective barrels and warning flagging where surfaces are impaired. If determined, signs may be needed on sidewalks to direct pedestrians around construction zone. Temporary stop and one-way signs may be needed until permanent signs are installed.

All signs, barricades, and barrels shall be in accordance with materials Specification M9.30.2 of the Department's "Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges, 1988 Edition.

Protection of Utilities and Property

The Contractor shall be responsible for maintenance and protection of all utilities and shall repair at their own expense any damage to such structures caused by their act or neglect, and shall leave them in as good condition as they were previous to the commencement of the work. In cases of damage to utilities caused by them resulting in an emergency, the Contractor shall promptly warn the Owner and shall, if requested, furnish laborers to work temporarily under the Owner's direction in getting access to the utility. Pipes or other structures damaged by the operation of the Contractor may be repaired by the Town, Department or Company, which suffers the loss. The cost of such repairs shall be at the expense of the Contractor.

PROPOSAL

To the Town of Arlington, Massachusetts, herein called the TOWN, acting through its Town Manager; the undersigned, as bidder, declares as follows:

This proposal is based solely on his own investigation and research and not in reliance upon any survey, report or representations of any employee, officer or agent of the TOWN; and the undersigned proposes and agrees that if this proposal is accepted, he will contract with the TOWN, this Contract Bid Form being part of and included in said CONTRACT, to provide all necessary supervision, labor, equipment, machinery, tools, apparatus, and other means of service necessary to complete the requirements in the CONTRACT; and that he will take in full payment thereof the following sums to wit:

Bidders must bid on each item. All entries in the Contract Bid Form must be made clearly and in ink, and prices must be written in both words and figures in the space provided. Bidders should insert computed totals in the spaces provided therein:

Time of Completion

The work specified under this contract shall begin July 1, 2018 and end June 30, 2019 with a second (July 1, 2019 - June 30, 2020) and third (July 1, 2020 - June 30, 2021) year renewal option in one (1) year increments at the sole discretion of the Town of Arlington. Renewal years are subject to appropriation of Funds.

Bid Submission

Each bid must be submitted in a sealed envelope bearing on the outside the name of the bidder, their address, and the name of the project for which the bid is submitted, and the name and number of the Contract for which the bid is submitted. If forwarded by mail, the sealed envelope containing the bid must be enclosed in another envelope addressed as follows:

The Owner will receive sealed bids until the time, and at the location designated in the Notice to Contractors. Bids received after this time will not be accepted. All interested parties are invited to attend; bids shall be opened publicly and read aloud.

Interpretation of Basic Estimate of Quantities

Attention is directed to the fact that the quantities of work to be done are based on observations and available data. The estimated quantities are approximate and should be used only as a guide. No quantities are guaranteed under this contract.

Insurance Requirements

The limits of the several kinds of liability insurance required for this Contract, in addition to insurance for Workmen's Compensation are as listed as follows:

- a. Bodily Injury Liability insurance, in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for injuries, including wrongful death to any one person, and subject to the same limit for each person to an amount of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) as account of one accident.
- b. Broad Form Property Damage Liability Insurance in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for damages on account of any one accident, and in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for damages on account of all accidents.
- c. Automobile Bodily Injury Liability Insurance, in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for injuries, including wrongful death to any one person and subject to the same limit for each person in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) on account of one accident.
- d. Automobile Property Damage Insurance in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for damages on account of any one accident and in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for damages on account of all accidents.
- e. Contractors Public Liability Insurance in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for each occurrence and in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) annual aggregate.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. Receipt of Bids

The Town may consider informal any bid not prepared and submitted in accordance with the provisions hereof and may waive any informality in or reject any bids. Any bid may be withdrawn before the time for the opening of bids. Any bid received after the time and date specified shall not be considered. No bidder may withdraw his/her bid for a period of 30 days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays after actual date of the opening thereof.

2. Preparation of Bid

Each bid shall be submitted on the forms attached to these documents. The bid forms may be removed and submitted separately from the other documents. All blank spaces for bid prices must be filled in with the unit price for the item or the lump sum for which the proposal is made. Bidders must bid on each item. All entries in the entire proposal must be made clearly, and prices written in both words and figures in the spaces provided.

3. Bid Security

Every bid submitted by contractors shall be accompanied by a bid deposit in the form of cash. certified check, treasurer's or cashier's check, or a bid bond issued by a responsible bank or trust company and made payable to the Town of Arlington. The amount of the bid deposit shall be 5% of the amount of the bid. All security except those of the three lowest responsible and eligible bidders will be returned within ten days, Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded, after opening of the bid. 6. Laws and Regulations

7. Withdrawal of Bids

9. Obligation of Bidder

10. Omissions, Discrepancies, Interpretations and Addenda

Should a bidder find discrepancies in, or omissions from, the drawings or contract documents, or should he/she have questions as to the interpretation of the plans or contract documents he/she shall submit such in writing to the Director of Purchasing at least five (5) days before the date herein set for the opening of bids. An interpretation will be mailed by certified mail to prospective bidders at the addresses given by them on or about two (2) days before the opening of bids. Signed copies of all addenda shall be included with the bid; omission of the signed addendum shall be cause for rejection of the bid.

11. Record of Address

Prospective bidders shall at the time plans and specifications are secured place on file with the Director of Purchasing their address, and are required to make any changes necessary to insure that the record is accurate, complete, and up to date.
