The meeting was called to order at 7:28pm.

- 1. Approval of September 10 minutes approved unanimously.
- 2. Treasurer's Report DEFERRED Jeff absent.
 - Grantee documents
 - Meeting with Town fiscal officer re ACC 2019 grant amount
- 3. Vote on new members (Elisa Hupp; Heidi Kendig):

Elisa is still deciding.

Heidi Kendig was voted in unanimously to join ACC. Becky will inform the Board of Selectmen to set the procedure in motion.

- 4. ACC-ACAC Alliance
 - Vote on our representative for ACAC Core Committee: Kimberley was voted unanimously.
 - Adding new members to our MCC list
 - Written guidelines from Town Council regarding how Grants will be managed: There is no conflict of interest for the Grants Committee/ACC to fund individual entities of ACAC. ACC needs to create a procedure for distributing the Resource Devt. Funds according to the Fiscal Year, not the Calendar year as it is for MCC funds.
 - Publicity re new affiliation How to publicize? When?: The consensus was that it would suffice to put the new affiliation (Grants Committee of ACAC/aka ACC) on the footer of emails with a reference to artsarlington.org.
 - Review of Orientation Meeting and assigned tasks:

- Develop a method for determining underserved, underrepresented or vulnerable populations: Request information from Town Agencies such as the Planning Dept.; Health & Human Services; clients of Food Bank; Housing Authority; Housing Corp of Arlington (HCA); etc.
- Learn more about EBT (Electronic Benefits Transfer) partnership program.
 It was discussed that ACC would prefer to have input into what tasks are assigned. Ultimately, because ACC personnel is limited, the 3 ACAC Resource Development personnel on the Grants Committee would best handle the process and tasks.
 ACC Priority: Develop procedures for non-MCC funds, after MCC grants are set in January.

Action Items: Kimberley will bring this up with ACAC, as well as the following:

-- \$5,000 from ACAC budget for ACC: Will it be given to ACC for use in this grant cycle?

- -- ACC members should be listed on the Grants Committee page of artsarlington.org website.
- 5. TOWN DAY: recap.: It was successful in bringing attention to artsarlington.org.

2019 grant cycle -- [FROM MASS-CULTURE.ORG: *Applicant eligibility:* Applicants must reside in Massachusetts and should have been engaged in the kind of activity for which funds are requested for at least one year.] To date, the MCC/Arlington CC Application website has 4 proposals submitted (\$4,550), 4 in process (\$4,350), and 2 drafts left over from last year.

- Publicity: Dave sent the press release with guidelines to ACC mailing list, Your Arlington, Arlington Advocate, ACC FB and artsarlington.org.
- Applicant Information meeting, Sept. 17, 7-8:30pm, Arlington Senior Center Art Room, 27 Maple St.: Dave and Lisbet held the meeting, changed to the ground floor when they arrived, for convenience. Three people came: Paul Marotta (Project: photo wall to create connection in East Arlington between low-income community at Freemont St. and rest of East Arlington); Karen Kumor, Philharmonic Society of Arl. (Project: commission); and Glenn Litton of docuthis.com, former WGBH Executive Producer (Project: Video of history of Mill Brook running by Old Schwamb Mill – major project). Dave suggested to Paul and Glenn that their projects would most likely need more time for development than this year's deadline would allow.
- 6. Liaison check-ins re Grantee status on projects/Final Reports/etc. Final Reports are sent to Jeff. As his Treasurer folder on dropbox is still unviewable by others, we'll ask him to bring it on a thumbdrive for us to add it to dropbox, so status can be checked.
