The conditions of employment as set forth in Sections 26 to 27D and 27F of Chapter 149 of the General Laws, as amended, shall prevail in the execution of the work under this contract.

Attention is called to the fact that minimum wage rates and health and welfare and pension fund contributions are established for this contract and are a part of the specifications.

Work under this contract shall be governed by M.G.L.Ch.30, Sec.39M.

The conditions of employment as set forth in Federal Wage Determination MA080006 dated April 10, 2009, issued by the U.S. Department of Labor, shall prevail in the execution of the work under this contract.

Attestation Forms pursuant to M.G.L. Ch. 62C, Sec. 49A and M.G.L. Ch. 701 of the Acts of 1983 are enclosed and shall be submitted with bids.

Proposals are for Road Markings and Line Striping on various roads in the Town of Arlington, Massachusetts.

It is the intention of the Owner to award the Contract to the lowest qualified responsive bidder. The bidder must submit a bid on all bid items in the Contract.

All proposals to include prices in both writing and in figures, and must be signed by the bidder with his business address.

An increase or decrease in the quantity of work shall not be regarded as a sufficient ground for an increase in the unit prices.

To receive consideration, bids must be in the hands of the Purchasing Agent or his authorized representative not later than the day and hour above mentioned. I INSTRUCTION TO BIDDERS

1. Receipt of Bids

The Town may consider informal any bid not prepared and submitted in accordance with the provisions hereof and may waive any informality in or reject any bids. Any bid may be withdrawn before the time for the opening of bids. Any bid received after the time and date specified shall not be considered. No bidder may withdraw his/her bid for a period of 30 days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays after actual date of the opening thereof.

2. Preparation of Bid

Each bid shall be submitted on the forms attached to these documents. The bid forms may be removed and submitted separately from the other documents. All blank spaces for bid prices must be filled in with the unit price for the item or the lump sum for which the proposal is made. Bidders must bid on each item. All entries in the entire proposal must be made clearly, and prices written in both words and figures in the spaces provided.

Each bid must be in a sealed envelope addressed to the Office of the Purchasing Agent, 730 Massachusetts Avenue, Arlington, Massachusetts, 02476; and bearing on the outside the name of the bidder, his/her address, the name of the project for which the bid is submitted, and the notation ' **<u>BID ON: BID # 19-35 PAVEMENT MARKINGS AND LINE STRIPING PROJECT.</u>**

3. Bid Security

Every bid submitted by contractors shall be accompanied by a bid deposit in the form of cash, certified check, treasurer's or cashier's check, or a bid bond issued by a responsible bank or trust company and made payable to the Town of Arlington. The amount of the bid deposit shall be 5% of the amount of the bid. All security except those of the three lowest responsible and eligible bidders will be returned within ten days, Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays excluded, after opening of the bid. All bid securities will be returned on the execution of the contract or if no award is made within 30 days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, after the actual date of the opening thereof, unless forfeited under the conditions herein stipulated.

In case a party to whom a contract is awarded shall fail or neglect to execute the contract and furnish the satisfactory bond in the time specified, the Town may determine the bidder has abandoned the contract and thereupon the proposal and acceptance shall be null and void, and the bid security accompanying the proposal shall be forfeited to the Town as liquidation damages for such failure or neglect and indemnify the Town for any loss which may be sustained by failure of the bidder to execute the contract and furnish the bonds as aforesaid, provided that, in case of death, disability, or other unforeseen circumstances affecting the bidder, such bid security may be returned to him/her.

After execution of the contract and acceptance of the bonds by the Town, the bid security accompanying the proposal of the successful bidder will be returned.

4. Time of Completion

The bidder must agree to commence work within ten (10) business days from the date of signing the contract and to fully complete the project within 45 Calendar days the time specified within the Special Provisions section of this document.

5. Performance and Labor Material Bonds

A bond in the sum of 50% of the total amount of the Contract by the successful bidder and an additional bond in equal amount covering the payment for all labor and materials used in the work will be required. A surety company authorized to do business in Massachusetts and satisfactory to the Town of Arlington must provide these bonds. These bonds will be required at the execution of the contract. Attorneys-in-fact who sign contract bonds must file with each bond a certified and effectively dated copy of their power of attorney.

6. Laws and Regulations

The bidder's attention is directed to the fact that all applicable State laws, Town of Arlington Bylaws, municipal ordinances, and the rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over construction of the project shall apply to the contract throughout, and they shall be deemed to be included in the contract the same as though herein written out in full.

7. Withdrawal of Bids

Upon proper written request and identification, Bids may be withdrawn only as follows:

a. At any time before the designated time for the opening of Bids.

b. Death or serious injury of a principal.

c. With the written approval of the Town of Arlington Office of the Purchasing Director.

d. At any time after the expiration of the period during which withdrawal is prohibited provided the bid has not been accepted by the Town.

8. Execution of Contract

The party to whom the contract is awarded shall be required to execute the contract and furnish the bonds duly executed with a satisfactory surety company within five days, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays, of the date of the mailing of the notice to the bidder according to the address given by him/her, that the contract is ready for execution.

9. Obligation of Bidder

At the time of the opening of bids, each bidder shall be presumed to have read and to be thoroughly familiar with the contract documents. The failure or omission of any bidder to receive or examine any form, instrument, or documents shall in no way relieve any bidder from the obligation in respect to his bid.

10. Omissions, Discrepancies, Interpretations and Addenda

Should a bidder find discrepancies in, or omissions from, the drawings or contract documents, or should he/she have questions as to the interpretation of the plans or contract documents he/she shall submit such in writing to the Director of Purchasing at least five (5) days before the date herein set for the opening of bids. An interpretation will be mailed by certified mail to prospective bidders at the addresses given by them on or about two (2) days before the opening of bids. Signed copies of all addenda shall be included with the bid; omission of the signed addendum shall be cause for rejection of the bid.

11. Record of Address

Prospective bidders shall at the time plans and specifications are secured place on file with the Director of Purchasing their address, and are required to make any changes necessary to insure that the record is accurate, complete, and up to date.

12. Massachusetts Sales and Use Tax

Materials purchased for permanent installation in the work will be exempt from the Massachusetts Sales and Use tax. Each bidder shall consider this exemption in calculating his/her bid for the work.

13. State Tax Affidavit

Prospective bidders are required to certify that all state tax returns have been filed and all state taxes have been paid in order to be eligible to enter into a contract with the Town on this project. The included form is to be used for this purpose and is to be completed and returned as part of the bid and proposal.

14. Minimum Wage Rates

Prevailing rates for wages for work performed under this Contract will be as predetermined by the Commissioner of Labor and Industries of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in accordance with the provisions of Sections 26 to 27D, inclusive, of c.149 of M.G.L. A schedule of the prevailing wages is included in the Minimum Wage Rates Section.

15. Sub-bids

No sub bids shall be sought in connection with this Contract.

16. All bidders shall submit the following supplemental information with a fee proposal:







2. General

V SPECIAL PROVISIONS

- 6-INCH REFLECTORIZED WHITE LINES (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS): This
 work shall consist of the application of 6-inch white reflectorized thermoplastic markings
 on existing roads for lane lines and edge lines and shall include suitable traffic control
 and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to
 provide a safer environment for workers. Payment shall be made by the Lineal Foot.
- 6-INCH REFLECTORIZED WHITE LINES (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS): This work shall consist of the application of 6-inch white reflectorized thermoplastic markings

on existing roads for **broken lines and dotted lines** and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Payment shall be made by the Lineal Foot.

- 4. <u>6-INCH REFLECTORIZED YELLOW LINES (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS):</u> This work shall consist of the application of 6-inch white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for center lines and edge lines and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Payment shall be made by the Lineal Foot.
- 5. <u>6-INCH REFLECTORIZED YELLOW LINES (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of 6-inch yellow reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for **broken lines and dotted lines** and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Payment shall be made by the Lineal Foot.
- 6. <u>12-INCH REFLECTORIZED WHITE LINES (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of 12-inch white thermoplastic markings on existing roads for **bus stops and stop lines** and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Payment shall be made by the Lineal Foot.
- 7. <u>24-INCH REFLECTORIZED WHITE LINES (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of 24-inch white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for **crosswalks** and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. - 11. **TRAFFIC SYMBOLS WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS):** This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for **bike lane direction arrow** and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.
- 12. <u>TRAFFIC SYMBOLS WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for **bike sharrow symbols** and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.
- 13. <u>TRAFFIC SYMBOLS WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for **bike detection symbols** and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.
- 15. <u>TRAFFIC SYMBOLS WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for Left Turn Arrow symbols and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.
- 16. <u>TRAFFIC SYMBOLS WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for Left/Thru Arrow symbols and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.
- 17. <u>TRAFFIC SYMBOLS WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for **Right Turn Arrow symbols** and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer

environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.

- 22. <u>TRAFFIC LETTERING WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for Text "BUS" (4' x 6') and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.
- 23. <u>TRAFFIC LETTERING WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for Text "6-9AM" and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.
- 24. **TRAFFIC LETTERING WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS):** This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for **Text "ONLY" (6' x 7'-5.5")** and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer

environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.

- 25. <u>TRAFFIC LETTERING WHITE (THERMOPLASTIC MARKINGS)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of white reflectorized thermoplastic markings on existing roads for Text "BUS" (6' x 5'-2.5") and shall include suitable traffic control and/or devices to prevent vehicles from traveling on the newly painted sections and to provide a safer environment for workers. Symbols must be compliant with MUTCD size requirements and layout requirements.
- HIGH FRICTION SURFACE TREATMENT (GREEN): This work shall consist of the application of Green High Friction Surface Treatment for bicycle facilities on existing roads. Payment shall be made by the Square Foot.
- 27. <u>HIGH FRICTION SURFACE TREATMENT (TERRA COTTA RED)</u>: This work shall consist of the application of Terra Cotta Red High Friction Surface Treatment in coordination with 6" white thermoplastic skip striping for Bus Lane facilities on existing roads. Payment shall be made by the Square Foot.
- 28. **LAYOUT AND PRE-MARKING SERVICES:** This work shall consist of providing layout and pre-marking of line striping as needed in coordination with the Arlington Engineering Division and/or Department of Public Works for application of new High Friction Surface Treatment. Payment shall be made by the Hour.
- 2. Work Schedule

Work on this project shall require a preconstruction meeting with the Arlington Police Department, Engineering Division and Public Works to coordinate work, schedule, traffic safety and management and Traffic Police Details. No work shall be performed on Saturdays, Sundays, or Holidays without first coordinating and requesting permission from the Town. It is anticipated and recommended that work be performed at night. However in order to provide notice to the Community in advance a request and notification to the Town shall be provided at least 48 hours in advance.

3. Time of Completion

The work specified under this contract shall be completed no later than October 1, 2019, *with the exception of the Items #27 & #28 which shall be completed by August 31, 2019*

4. Performance, Labor and Material Bonds

A bond in the sum 50% of the total amount of the Contract by the successful bidder and an additional bond in equal amount covering the payment for all labor and materials used in the work shall be required. A surety company authorized to do business in Massachusetts and satisfactory to the Town of Arlington must provide these bonds. These bonds shall be required at the execution of the Contract. Attorneys-in-fact who sign contract bonds must file with each bond a certified and effectively dated copy of their power of attorney.

5. Bid Submission

Each bid must be submitted in a sealed envelope bearing on the outside the name of the bidder, his/her address, and the name of the project for which the bid is submitted, and the name and number of the Contract for which the bid is submitted. If forwarded by mail, the sealed envelope containing the bid must be enclosed in another envelope addressed as follows:

The Owner will receive sealed bids until the time, and at the location designated in the Notice to Contractors. Bids received after this time will not be accepted. All interested parties are invited to attend; bids shall be opened publicly and read aloud.

6. Interpretation of Basic Estimate of Quantities

Attention is directed to the fact that the quantities of work to be done are based on observations and available data. The estimated quantities are approximate and should be used only as a guide. No quantities are guaranteed under this contract.

7. Prosecution of Work and Provisions for Travel

The Contractor shall give notice in writing to the Engineer at least seven days in advance of beginning any work affecting the maintenance of traffic where work affects the street in use by the public.

Before starting any work under this Contract, the Contractor shall submit his schedule of operations as provided herein.

The Contractor must prosecute the work efficiently and with the least possible delay.

The Contractor shall coordinate with the Police Department and the Arlington Department of Public Works prior to work commencing. It is expected that a representative from the Town will be on hand to direct the contractor and answer questions as needed.

8. Provisions for Access at All Locations

The Contractor shall cooperate and provide access to all properties as well as can reasobally be provided due to the operations and applications in connection with this project.

THE TOWN WILL NOT ACCEPT ANY MATERIALS DELIVERED TO ANY PROJECT IN MOTOR VEHICLES OR SEMI-TRAILER UNITS THAT EXCEED THE LEGAL MAXIMUM GROSS WEIGHT ALLOWED FOR THE PARTICULAR CLASS, AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 19 A OF CHAPTER 90 OF THE GENERAL LAWS OF MASSACHUSETTS.

9. Insurance Requirements

The limits of the several kinds of liability insurance required for this Contract, in addition to insurance for Workmen's Compensation are as listed as follows:

a. Bodily Injury Liability insurance, in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for injuries, including wrongful death to any one person, and subject to the same limit for each person to an amount of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) as account of one accident.

b. Broad Form Property Damage Liability Insurance in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for damages on account of any one accident, and in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for damages on account of all accidents.

c. Automobile Bodily Injury Liability Insurance, in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for injuries, including wrongful death to any one person and subject to the same limit for each person in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) on account of one accident.

d. Automobile Property Damage Insurance in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for damages on account of any one accident and in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for damages on account of all accidents.

e. Contractors Public Liability Insurance in an amount not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) for each occurrence and in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) annual aggregate.

10. Maintenance of Traffic

During construction, the Contractor shall maintain two way traffic at all times and work with Traffic Police Details during operations.

The use of a P olice Safety Detail does not eliminate the need for proper warning signs and traffic control devices during the course of construction.

It shall be the sole responsibility of the contractor to provide & employ appropriate construction signage and barriers/cones/etc as needed. All signs and devices shall be in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways and all applicable MassDOT Standards/Requirements.

During the entire course of work, the applicant and/or owner shall be responsible to properly delineate & protect the job site in accordance with current MUTCD Standards to the full satisfaction of the Arlington Police Department. Failure or inability to provide appropriate devices & signage may result in work being suspended at the discretion of the Town of Arlington.

Reflective barrels, construction signage and other devices deemed necessary by the Engineer shall be utilized to direct vehicular and pedestrian traffic safely through the construction zone.

All work left unattended shall be plated or ramped and suitable work safety devices and methods shall be utilized as necessary. All sidewalks and ramps shall be barricaded with reflective barrels and warning flagging where surfaces are impaired. If determined, signs may be needed on sidewalks to direct pedestrians around construction zone. Temporary stop and one-way signs may be needed until permanent signs are installed.

All signs, barricades, and barrels shall be in accordance with materials Specification M9.30.2 of the Department's "Standard Specifications for Highways and Bridges, 1988 Edition.

11. Protection of Utilities and Property

The Contractor shall be responsible for maintenance and protection of all utilities and shall repair at his/her own expense any damage to such structures caused by his/her act or neglect, and shall leave them in as good condition as they were previous to the commencement of the work. In cases of damage to utilities caused by him resulting in an emergency, the Contractor shall promptly warn the Owner and shall, if requested, furnish laborers to work temporarily under the Owner's direction in getting access to the utility. Pipes or other structures damaged by the operation of the Contractor may be repaired by the Town, Department or Company, which suffers the loss. The cost of such repairs shall be at the expense of the Contractor.

12. Notice to Owners of Utilities

When necessary, written notice shall be given by the Contractor to all public service corporations or officials owning or having charge of publicly or privately owned utilities of his/her intention to commence operations affecting such utilities at least one week in advance of the commencement of such operations, and the Contractor shall at that time file a copy of such notice with the Engineer.

Before the Contractor begins any work or operations, which might damage any subsurface structures, he shall carefully locate all such structures and conduct his/her operations so as to avoid any damage to them. 860.20 General.

This item of work consists of furnishing materials and the application of Reflectorized Pavement Markings in accordance with the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Department of Public Works, Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, current edition.

MATERIALS

860.40 General.

Materials shall be as specified under the particular payment item being used and shall meet the appropriate requirements specified in the following Subsections of Division ill, Materials:

CONSTRUCTION METHODS

860.60 Equipment.

All equipment used for the application of pavement markings shall be of standard commercial manufacture. All other equipment and devices necessary for the application of the pavement markings and protection thereof and for the protection to the traveling public shall be as usually required for work of this type and shall be furnished by the Contractor.

The pavement marking equipment shall be operated at the speed and in accordance with other requirements of the manufacturer, unless otherwise directed by the Engineer.

Truck mounted equipment is approved for the application of pavement markings except in such cases where in the Engineer's judgment travel will be unreasonably delayed and/or the quality of the work performed by the machine is unsatisfactory.

860.61 Layout of Work.

A schedule of pavement marking operations shall be furnished by the Contractor for the approval of the Engineer prior to the application of any pavement markings. This schedule must be in the office of the Engineer 7 days prior to the proposed date of application of any pavement markings.

The Engineer will provide at a convenient location on the roadway a line of reference for use by the Contractor in establishing the location of markings. The line of reference shall be at a maximum of 50 foot intervals by means deemed satisfactory by the Engineer. All markings shall follow the line

of reference without deviation. Any line deviating from the establishing control of incorrect width shall be reapplied, as directed by the Engineer in accordance with Subsection 860.62.

860.62 Application of Markings.

Pavement markings shall be applied as follows:

No thinners shall be used for the above listed pavement marking applications except in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications and at the direction of the Engineer.

No paint or pavement marking material shall be heated above the temperature marked on the container.

Markings shall be applied only in seasonable weather and in accordance with good painting practices.

The surface shall be dry and free of sand, grease, oil or other foreign substances prior to the application. The Contractor shall prepare the surface to accept the application as part of this item, with no additional compensation. The Engineer will make the final determination for all of the foregoing.

Bituminous concrete pavements shall have been in place for 48 hours prior to the application of pavement markings except preformed permanent plastic pavement markings which can be applied immediately. When it is necessary to expedite the flow of traffic, the Engineer may reduce the waiting period as is deemed necessary.

If for any reason material is spilled or tracked on the highway, or any markings applied by the Contractor, in the Engineer's judgment, fail to conform to Subsection 860.61, because of a deviation from the desired pattern, the Contractor shall remove such material by a method that is not injurious to the roadway surface and is acceptable to the Engineer, clean the roadway surface and prepare the surface for a reapplication of markings and reapply the markings as directed without additional compensation for any of the foregoing corrective operations.

The ambient (air) temperature for thermoplastic application is to be a minimum of 45 OF and rising at the time of marking operations. If work has started and air temperatures fall below 45 OF and continuous cooling is indicated, work shall be stopped. In cool weather conditions, temporary drops down to 40 OF will be tolerated, providing temperatures also vary upwards. Sustained striping (greater than one hour) at 40 OF shall not be allowed. Starting work at air temperatures lower than 45 OF shall not be allowed.

860.63 Protection of Markings.

Markings shall remain protected until sufficiently dry to bear traffic on highways that are open to traffic. Markings shall be protected by traffic cones of not less than 28" in height except in the case of markings which cure to a no track condition in 180 seconds or less in the latter case protection may be provided by a convoy of vehicles with suitable warning devices to warn overtaking or on corning traffic that the pavement marking operation is in progress.

A. Broken Lines.

On tangents and on curves of 1000 foot radius or greater at least 1 cone shall be placed on every other bar. On curves of less than 1000 foot radius 1 cone shall be placed on every bar unless otherwise directed by the Engineer.

B. Solid Lines.

On tangents and on curves of 1000 foot radius or greater, cones shall be spaced not over 80 feet apart and on curves of less than 1000 foot radius the spacing shall be not over 50 feet unless otherwise directed by the Engineer. On edge line adjacent to the median wider spacing may be used at the direction of the Engineer. In order to control the proper positioning of the cones during the drying period, the Contractor shall assign sufficient personnel as determined by the Engineer. Such control is dependent on traffic density, cone widths, etc.

860.64 Accommodation of Traffic.

All warning signs and traffic control devices as required shall be in accordance with Section 850 of these Specifications.

No work shall be done on this item on roadways open to traffic on Saturdays, Sundays, the day before a holiday or on a holiday except when otherwise specifically directed by the Engineer.

Both lanes of two-lane highways shall remain open to traffic at all times. On multi-lane highways only one lane shall be closed to traffic at any time.

Work under this item may be suspended, at the discretion of the Engineer, during peak traffic hours or at any other time when, in his judgment, traffic is being unduly hampered or delayed by the work, under this item.

COMPENSATION

860.80 Method of Measurement.

Markings are to be paid for on the actual length of lines applied under the various items of the Contract.

The lengths of solid lines will be obtained by:

- 1. Calculation from established base line stations or
- 2. Use of a measuring wheel or
- 3. Vehicle odometer readings.

The length of broken lines (except for broken lines less than 10 feet, the actual length shall be used) will be obtained by using 114 of the results obtained above for solid lines. Patterns, other than lines, are to be paid for by the square foot area under the item in the Contract.

860.81 Basis of Payment.

The work under these items will be paid for at the contract unit price under each item of the Contract based on the measurements as determined by the Engineer. The contract prices shall include all material, labor, and equipment required or incidental to the satisfactory completion of the work.

MATERIAL REQUIREMENTS

Reflective Glass Spheres.

Reflective glass spheres for drop-on application shall conform to the fol lowing requirements:

The glass spheres shall be c olorless, clean, transparent, free from milkiness or excessive air bubbles, and essentially clean from surface scarring or scratching. They shall be spherical in shape and at least 80 % of the glass beads shall be true spheres when tested in accordance with ASTM is D-1155, Procedure A.

The refractive index of the spheres shall be a minimum of 1.5 as determined by the liquid immersion method at 77°F.

The silica content of the glass spheres shall not be less than 60%.

The glass spheres shall have the following gradation when tested in accordance with ASTM D-1214.

The glass spheres, Type I, s hall be c oated with a silane-type adherence coating to enhance embedding in and adherence to the applied binder film. The coated beads shall emit a yellow-green fluorescence when tested by the Danayl Chloride test procedure. The Type II glass spheres shall be treated with a moisture-proof coating. The beads shall show no tendency to adsorb moisture in storage and shall remain free

of clusters and lumps. The beads shall flow freely from the dispensing equipment at any time when surface and atmospheric conditions are satisfactory for marking operations. The moisture-resistance of the glass spheres s hall be determined on the ba s is of the following test:

Place one k ilogram of s pheres in a w ashed cotton bag hav ing a thr ead count of approximately 52 per square inch (warp and woof) and immerse the bag in a container of water for 30 seconds. Remove the bag and for ce excess water from the sample by squeezing the bag. Suspend and allow to drain for two hours at room temperature ($73 \pm 2^{\circ}$ F). Then mix the sample in the bag by shaking thoroughly. Pour the sample slowly into a clean, dry glass funnel having a stem 4 i nches in length, with a 0.4 i nch inside diameter stem entrance opening and a minimum exit opening of 0.25 inches. The entire sample shall flow freely through the funnel without stoppage. When first introduced into the funnel, if the spheres clog, it is permissible to lightly tap the funnel to initiate the flow.

Reflective glass spheres may be accepted at the job site on the basis of the manufacturer's certification, or they may be submitted to the Research and Materials Laboratory for testing.

Reflective glass spheres shall be shipped in moisture resistant bags. Each bag shall be marked with the name and address of the manufacturer and the name and net weight of t he material.

EQUIPMENT AND APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

E. STRIPING EQUIPMENT

The equipment shall have a system capable of applying the thermoplastic material in the manufacturer's recommended proportions and be mounted on a truck of sufficient size and stability, and with an adequate power source to produce lines of uniform dimension and prevent application failure. It shall be capable of placing stripes on the left and right sides and of placing two intermittent lines simultaneously. It shall also be capable of applying glass beads at the rate of 25 pounds per gallon. All guns must be in full view of the operator at all times. The equipment shall be provided with a metering device to register the accumulated installed footage for each gun each day. Each vehicle shall include at least one operator who shall be a technical expert in equipment operations and thermoplastic markings application techniques.

Equipment shall have such a design that the pressure gauges for each proportioning pump are constantly visible to the oper ator at all times during its operation so that any fluctuation and pressure difference can be addressed immediately.

F. SURFACE PREPARATION

The surface on w hich the thermoplastic material is placed shall be clean and dry. It is anticipated that the application will be applied to an older thermoplastic application in need of refurbishment. Contractor shall follow all manufacturer requirements and recommendations for the application in order to provide a high quality and durable product.

G. APPLICATION

1. Thermoplastic

The thermoplastic markings adhere to all manufacturer recommendations for application thickness shall have a thickness of 25 mils \pm 1 mil, calculated without drop-on glass beads. All markings shall have uniform thickness with a uniform distribution of glass beads throughout the line width. The width of lines shall be as specified with a tolerance of 0.25 inches. Markings shall have sharp edges and cutoff at the ends.

2. Glass Beads

The glass beads shall be applied by the double drop method, which requires that Type I and Type II reflective glass spheres be injected into or dropped onto the thermoplastic Marking with a minimum total application of 25 pounds per gallon. Type I beads shall be applied first, immediately followed by Type II beads. The beads shall adhere to the cured thermoplastic or all marking operations shall cease until corrections are made.

3. Temperature Limitations

During marking operations, the pavement surface where thermoplastic material is to be placed shall meet the minimum temperature requirements of the manufacturer or 40° F and the air temperature shall be at least 35° F or whichever is higher. The pavement surface temperature, and the air temperature shall be determined at the start of each day of marking operation and at any time deemed necessary by the Engineer. The spraying temperatures shall be i n accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations.

4. Application Rates

Application rates will be checked by the Engineer at convenient intervals by comparing tallies of m aterials used to the I ength of I ines placed. F or initial application and occasionally during the course of work, the Engineer may also check application to a pre-weighed sheet specifically placed for test purposes. Drop-on spheres shall not be applied in this test.

5. Protecting Newly installed Markings

Newly installed markings shall be protected from tracking during the setting period by one or more of the following methods:

- 1) Cone off wet lines from traffic
- 2) Use a convoy of moving vehicles to prevent traffic from crossing wet lines
- 3) Saturate lines with glass beads to prevent tracking.

SECTION M7

PAINTS AND PROTECTIVE COATINGS

M7.00.0 General Requirements for Paints and Protective Coatings.

A. General.

All paint shall conform to the following general requirements.

1. Materials.

The raw materials used in the following specifications for paints and protective coatings shall conform to the specification designed by ASTM, Federal serial number or AASHTO unless specified otherwise in the individual specification. Subsequent amendments to the specifications quoted shall apply to all raw materials and finished products. No "or equal" substitution for any specified material shall be made without written consent of the Engineer.

2. Proportions.

Paint proportions and percentages given in the following specification are expressed by weight unless stated otherwise.

3. Condition in the container.

Paint and protective coatings shall be homogeneous, free of contaminant and of a consistency suitable for use in the capacity for which it is specified. The finished product shall be well ground and the pigment shall be properly dispersed and suspended in the vehicle according to the requirements of the paint or protective coating. The dispersion shall be of such nature that the pigment does not settle badly, does not cake or thicken in the container, and does not become granular, jelled or curdled. Any settlement of pigment in the paint or protective coating shall be a thoroughly wetted soft mushy mass permitting the complete and easy vertical penetration of a paddle. Settled pigment shall be easily dispersed, with a minimum resistance to the sidewise manual motion of the paddle across the bottom of the container, to form a smooth uniform product of the proper consistency. The manufacturer shall include in the paint the necessary additives for control of sagging, pigment settling, leveling, and other qualities of a satisfactory working material. The paint shall possess satisfactory properties in all respects which affect its application and curing.

4. Packaging.

The finished paint or protective coating shall be furnished in new five gallon, round, nontapered containers no thinner than 0.0250 in. unless otherwise specified. The containers shall have the lug type crimp lids with ring seals and be equipped with ears and bails. The containers shall meet U. S. Department of Transportation Hazardous Materials Shipping Regulations. The container must be lined if necessary so as to prevent attack by the paint. The lining must not come off the can as skins.

The following information shall be labeled on each can in a clear legible manner:

- a) Name of Manufacturer
- b) Place of Manufacture
- c) Manufacturer's Batch Number
- d) Mass DPW Specification Number
- e) Date of Manufacture

Precautions concerning the handling and the application of the paint or protective coating shall be shown on the label.

B. Sampling and Testing.

1. Sampling.

At least one sample, not less than one quart, shall be taken for each batch or less of each kind of paint to be used. Samples must be taken in clean, dry, airtight, wide mouth metal cans and the sample must fill the can to within one inch from the top. Each sample forwarded to the Research and Materials Section shall be accompanied by the name of the manufacturer, the batch number, the specification number and the quantity of paint represented.

Before the Contractor will be permitted to use any paint, the material proposed to be used shall have been sampled, tested and approved.

The manufacturer, as may be required by the Engineer, shall permit access to an inspection of his paint and all operations involved in the manufacture of these materials; shall permit sampling of raw materials and shall furnish such reasonable facilities as the Engineer may require for such inspection.

2. Testing.

Testing of paints will be done at the Research and Materials Section in accordance with the latest methods of Federal Test Method Standard Number 141, ASTM and Methods in use by the Research and Materials Section.

In addition the Department reserves the right to make use of any information or methods of testing to determine the quality of paint and paint materials.

The manufacturer may obtain dry color chips from the Research and Materials Section in order to obtain the proper sample color if he so desires or he may submit a wet sample of the paint which he proposes to furnish. If the color of the wet sample is approved, paints matching the wet sample will, as regards to color, be accepted.

The Contractor shall assume all costs arising from the use of patented materials, equipment, devices or processes used or incorporated in the work and agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and its duly authorized representative from all suits at law or action of every nature for or on account of the use of any patented materials, equipment, device or processes.

An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. Any apprentice not registered with DLS/DAS regardless of whether or not they are registered with any other federal, state, local, or private agency must be paid the journeyworker's rate for the trade.

• The wage rates will remain in effect for the duration of the project, except in the case of multi-year public construction projects. For construction projects lasting longer than one year, awarding authorities must request an updated wage schedule. Awarding authorities are required to request these updates no later than two weeks before the anniversary of the date the contract was executed by the awarding authority and the general contractor. For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. Contractors are required to obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities, and to pay no less than these rates to covered workers.
