# MBTA Forging Ahead Initiative

#### Our Plan to Bring Back Service

Updated April 5, 2021



From the T's website: "As of April 2021, we're able to:

- Begin the process of returning all bus and subway service to prepandemic levels as quickly as possible
- Increase Commuter
   Rail service by up to
   88% over current
   levels, <u>starting April 5</u>,
   2021
- Accelerate <u>hiring and</u> <u>training for operators</u>, which will further allow us to increase service"



- Silver designation is active until 2025
- One of four Massachusetts communities with Silver designation (14 communities total that are BFCs)
  - Others with Silver: Provincetown, Nantucket, Boston
  - Somerville is only Gold level community; no platinum BFCs
- We will receive our Bike Friendly Community report card and survey results in a few weeks – will share that at a future meeting

# Chestnut Street at Chestnut Terrace

- TAC voted at May 12 meeting to submit recommendations to Select Board
- Includes safety improvement recommendations such as bump outs, refuge island, pedestrianactivated warning beacon, lane narrowing with bike lanes, and further work towards identifying how to approach possible longerterm project for geometric changes to Mystic/Chestnut



#### NACTO Update: May 18, 2021

26,000+ Comments on the MUTCD Submitted to the Federal Register NACTO submitted 400 comprehensive, practitioner-led comments
