What is "open space"?

Public and private land that is undeveloped for...


- Public access to nature (e.g. walking trails)
- Protecting water quality
- Protecting habitat (e.g. wetlands, threatened species, etc.)



What is recreation?

Indoor and outdoor facilities

- Parks
- Playgrounds
- Multi-use fields
- Basketball courts
- Ballfields



Why do we need an OSRP?

- ----> Maintain and enhance benefits of resources
- -----> Guide policy decisions for open space, natural resources, and recreational issues
- -----> Support efforts to acquire funding






