

- Project will create plan for creating trail connection and review alternatives for route alignment and intersection crossings
- Public outreach may take place in early to mid-December
- Project must be completed by June 30, 2022



Bike Parking Update


- Bike racks to be ordered for new locations/replacements:

- In discussions regarding bike parking in the Heights (commercial areas)








Data Update: Swan Place Eco Counter and Bluebikes


















- Daily bike average peak: Sept. 2019 1,658 trips
- Highest daily average 2020: Sept. 2020 1,507 trips
- Highest daily average 2021: June 2021 1,383 trips (updated from last month)





- Total trips YTD: 478,405 (+67,484 since last month)
- Bike Trips YTD: 257,802 (+34,329 since last month)
 - 39,268 trips in May
 - 41,491 in June
 - 37,127 in July
 - 38,097 in August
 - 39,937 in September
 - 22,195 in October so far
- Highest trip day in last 30 days: Sun. September 19 – 3,950 trips



Arlington Bluebikes Data

• Trip Data:

- 8,215 trips year-to-date in 2021
 - (+ 1,2 from last month)
- 1,046 trips in May
- 1,179 in June
- 1,244 in July
- 1,371 in August
- 1,564 in September
- 880 so far in October
- Greatest number of trips near Bikeway locations
- More than 10,000 trips on Bluebikes in Arlington since program started last year







Bluebikes Winter Operations

- Off-street stations to be picked up around Thanksgiving (week of Nov. 22), redeployment in April
- Winter storage is an additional fee the Town pays (\$2,500 per station)
- Off-street locations can operate yearround and avoid storage fee


Bluebikes Stations Off-Street Relocations

- Railroad Lot @ Bikeway to be moved to brick sidewalk behind 633-641
 Mass Ave
 - Requires action by the Select Board (expected Oct. 25)
- Linwood St @ Bikeway relocation to new sidewalk built by DPW behind existing sidewalk
- Relocations may occur by the end of the month






Linwood St at Minuteman Bikeway




Linwood St at Minuteman Bikeway New Off-Street Location


