- 2. DPW Tree Department Update (Tim)
  - Construction and trees news New trees at Whittemore Park are being watered by irrigation system watered 2x's a week
  - Tree Bylaw activity
    - i. 1 tree plan 53 Marathon St No trees except street tree (Ash) on Waldo street that will be protected with Construction Method 3 2x4s
  - Tree hearing(s) no hearings
  - Fall tree watering / Fall tree planting
    - i. Ball and burlap planting completed Forest/Summer, 10 evergreens on spring st
    - ii. Whittemore Robbins House: 2 Jefferson Elms. One of these is a Memorial Tree for AYCC's Elaine Shea
    - iii. New trees in Old Burying ground little smaller than anticipated, cedars and sugar maples
    - iv. 200 bare root planting in progress targeting heat islands and Article 16 areas. Tim L faced some refusals but trees were planted on Tanager St, 32 Appleton St, and Melvin.
    - v. Tree Equity Score Map can help plan for future tree planting (<u>Tree Equity Score</u>) Spring planting. The triangle near railroad parking (near Water St) another good location for new trees
  - Other
    - i. Broadway Water main first section will be replaced
    - ii. Stratton safe passage to schools project It was suggested that all but three trees should be kept; three are not viable for health reasons. Three committee members attended tonight's pre 25% planning meeting. The meeting wanted to hear from residents to understand town priorities. ATC made it clear that preservation of healthy large trees is a priority.

  - Arlington Housing Authority Menotomy Manor. 8 trees planted last week: 4 dogwoods, 3 maples, 1 honeylocust
    - o Watering plan maintenance team has spigots available recruited residents

- Heat zone targeted planting apartment building manager outreach (Steve)
  - Looking for language from Doug Heim for back of sidewalk plan
- Planting on private ways. No discussion. Looking for feedback from Doug Heim
- Back of sidewalk
  - o Looking for language from Town Counsel. Action: (Susan to check in w Heim)
  - UU Church in town center interested in trees
  - Robbins Farm
- Schools are a possibility for Trees Please funds and are already Town Property. Tim mentioned that Arbor Day plantings at elementary schools can resume after Covid
  - Follow up from Planning Dept meeting: (Eliza). Action: Eliza will contact Beth Locke from Chamber of Commerce to discuss ways private businesses can get involved in tree planting initiatives.

    - i. Steve is filling in the Big Tree section of the web site. Decided to identify the trees by neighborhood or school district rather than specific address
    - ii. Action: Steve will add link to website along with Arlington's tree equity map (Tree Equity Score)

    - iv. All members forward suggestions to Steve
    - v. Question Add links to arborists, tree removal (cranes)
  - Outreach to town orgs (ARB, ZBA, Park & Rec, Op Space, School Comm, ConComm)
  - Broader inclusion / equity of ATC materials, programs, and members/ translations
    - i. Construction guidelines and adopt-a-tree info translated
- 5. Report on Bylaw review for 2022 Warrant due in December
  - By Law triggers footprint 50% increase, new construction/demolition,
  - Applies only to Trees in set back great than 8" dbh
  - Changes proposed
    - i. Tree replacement planting with bond option dbh = removed dbh post bond to keep trees alive 3 years get the funds back
      - 1. Eric H (Select Board) suggested finance input
    - ii. Reduce protected tree dbh to 6"?- Lexingt, Wellesley, Camb and Concord all at 6"
    - iii. All trees on property, not just those in set back
    - iv. Change definition of substantial demolition (remodeling by gutting, and leaving only one wall) add more detail to make it more clear (i.e. removal of roof, removal of a wall) Action Susan look at Lexington/Cambridge by laws for definition
    - v. Other thoughts
      - 1. Building Permit
        - a. require affidavit re Tree By Law confer with town counsel?
        - b. Add a section on permit application
      - 2. Apply to any tree removal fees discounted
    - vi. Next Step
      - 1. Share Google doc and add feedback
    - vii. Request was made that we review Article 38 to be sure that tree bylaw applies in this situation
