# Flaw 1: Denial of voting privileges

- Not conducive to collaboration and inclusivity
- May undermine committee due to lower attendance
- Contrary viewpoints relegated to non-voting status

# Fix 1: Pagliasotti + Dennis 1 Amendments

- Give all members voting privileges
- One appointee by Moderator to serve as Chair
- Chair must be someone neutral on synthetic turf

# Flaw 2: All problems, no solutions

- Committee to report only potential problems with turf
- Many ways to eliminate or mitigate the potential issues
- Neighboring and cohort municipalities are innovating

## Fix 2: Dennis 2 Amendment

- Research experiences and innovations in other communities
- e.g., enhanced certification, natural infills, downcycling options
- Report a set of best practices for our use in the future

## Flaw 3: Moratorium

- Ends the Poet's Corner project before we learn more about it
- Poet's remains an uncapped landfill and embarrassing eyesore
- Chances of retaining open space on St. Camillus land go to nil

# Fix 3: Greenspon Amendment

- Poet's project goes before the Conservation Commission
- Further details of the Poet's deal are worked out
- Town Meeting votes on the project in the fall with more info

## Who does not have a moratorium?

### **Springfield**

→ two ongoing projects (Duggan Park and Central HS) to install 3 new turf fields

#### **Belmont**

→ installed turf field at High School in 2021 after committee concluded turf was safe

#### **Brookline**

→ installing turf at new Driscoll School after task force concluded turf was safe

#### **Boston**

→ installing new turf at Charlestown High School; declared no ban on turf

#### **Andover**

→ installing new turf at Bancroft Elementary; approved by Town Meeting last week

#### **Our eco-conscious neighbors**

→ Cambridge, Somerville, Medford, Winchester, Lexington, Watertown,...

# How did this get so complicated?

- No details of the study committee presented at the Select Board hearing
- Lack of early public scrutiny and feedback on committee proposal
- We are unlikely to reach any kind of satisfactory action on the article
- We should patch it with amendments, then vote the whole thing down
- Supporters can come back with a balanced and well-structured proposal
