Film Production Information and Application

These and other types of events require a permit issued by the Arlington Recreation Department.

This policy is in accordance with Park Commission Rules Regulations. To ensure park protection and reduce disruption, the Department enforces limit capacity and activities within the following guidelines.

General Guidelines:

- Special permission from the Arlington Parks and Recreation Department is required based on the size, content or times of the production. Some requests may be required to appear before the Park and Recreation Commission prior to filming. The Commission meets on the second Tuesday of every month.
- For protection against possible occurrence of personal injury, you must provide a Certificate of Insurance with a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 issued to: Town of Arlington with the Town of Arlington listed as additional insured. This Certificate ensures security in the unlikely event of personal injury occurring on town property as a result of your activities. You must request a Certificate of Insurance from your own insurance company, and have it dated for the entire period of time you are working in the Town of Arlington.
- For protection against possible damage to town property, you must provide a bond with a minimum security of \$5,000.00 issued to the Town of Arlington. The bond must be acquired from a local bonding company.

There is a \$25 non-refundable application fee payable to "The Town of Arlington". Additional permitting fees may be assessed by the Park Commission and the amount of those fees determined based on the size and scope of the project.

Depending on the size and scope of the project, a Police Detail may be required. For information about arranging for a Police Detail officer and/or posting "No Parking" signs, please contact the Arlington Police Department at 781-316-3900.

Please note the Arlington Parks and Recreation Commission may require additional conditions prior to permit approval.

Hello Director Connelly,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments via email on the Menotomy Rocks Park Play & Picnic Area proposal, as I will not be able to attend in person on October 21.

My wife and children have lived less than a block from the park since 2007. It is a great community resource and is one of the main reason we and other neighbors moved to this neighborhood. We raised our kids playing in the playground and skating on the pond.

For all the time that we have lived here, we have had dogs in our family, and this factored into the reason we moved to this neighborhood -- to be close to the park.

In recent years we've seen the Town's Park and Recs Dept become increasingly intolerant of dogs and dog families in the park. So draconian has the atmosphere become that it seems like a fetish to some to crack down on the idea that people might bring their dogs off leash to the park. I wish I were using hyperbole if I were to say that the Department has been allowing organized bow and arrow practices to start before 9am when the (incomprehensibly narrow) dog off leash hours in the park are still in effect. In other words, it has literally gotten so hostile that the Town is letting people shoot real live arrows from real live bows into the the field where dogs are peacefully running around in the mornings.

My input on the design is this: Expand off leash hours, and tone down the temperature on the hostility toward well behaved dogs and dog families.

Hi, Normally I wouldn't complain, but my son is terrified of dogs. He is 5 and last year he got bit in the face by a pitbull. It doesn't matter if the dog is big or small, he is terrified. We live within walking distance to parallel park and until recently, we tried to go there after dinner to burn off some extra energy before bed. Unfortunately we had to stop because the same 5 or so people are there every night with their dogs and they are all off leash. When we come to open the gate they all turn and look at us but nobody leashes their dog. They just turn and continue talking amongst themselves. It takes some coaxing to get my son to walk though the gate, by assuring him that i will keep him safe, despite the dogs. But after last week, I don't think he will ever go back. We were playing a game on the piece of equipment that you stand and jump on... I have no idea what it's called. All of a sudden four of these dogs began to chase each other, very fast and they came running through where we were and knocked my son over and almost me. They went around and around, back through the structure and playground area multiple times. Neither of us were hurt, but that's not the point. None of the owners were calling their dogs or trying to get them back on the leash... nothing! They just looked over and then back to their conversation. I consoled my kid since he was crying and scared, gathered our things and we left... after I told them exactly how I felt about them and their dogs. I just don't get it. Not only these people, but most people in Arlington think their dogs are children, it's insane Playgrounds are for children's to play and feel safe. I shouldn't have to worry that some idiots dog is going to scare or God forbid hurt my son. And it's not just about my son. These dogs would have really hurt a smaller child if they were chasing each other and happened to knock one over. These people are at the park every night after 5:30 ish. They have big and little dogs. And none of them are ever on a leash. They honestly look at me like I'm doing something wrong by bringing my kid into the park. I know there is already a sign on the gate that says no off leash dogs at any time... so I'm not sure what can really be done. But I just wanted to bring this to someone's attention because someones kid is going to get hurt eventually when these dogs start charging in circles chasing each other. And if that did happen, I wouldn't blame any kids parent for going after the dog or the owner. I'm sorry I went on and on but I really appreciate your time. I don't expect or even need a response email. I really just wanted to let someone know that this is going on, before someones kid gets hurt. Thank you, Amanda
