MINUTES of 2/17 approved as printed. Unanimous

ART 57 MINUTEMAN VOC TECH: Bouquillon walked the FinCom through a printed copy of a presentation he prepared for a Jan public hearing on the budget. He reviewed the evidence that the school is rightsizing as some programs are dropped, the staff shrinks and the number of member students increases. The proposed FY11 budget, based on a conservative estimate of state aid, not the Governor's budget, is decreased 7% from FY10 to \$16,238,679. Bouquillon also provided & talked to a member assessment package. The Arlington assessment would be \$2,739,795, a 11% decrease. Members asked & Bouquillon answered numerous questions. The school is considering adding courses that would attract students such as lab animal care and criminal justice. Their marketing effort has received "good comments". They are considering courses for adults in fields such as bio manufacturing and green technology. Such courses might yield a surplus. Last year 65% of graduates went on to higher education, about half of them to 4 yr programs.

ART 59 FACILITY FEASIBILITY BOND: Bouquillon described the work that has been done to assess the school facilities. He has worked closely w/ the MSBA which approves the process. .The roof leaks & must be replaced soon. The smoke stack was taken down as an emergency safety measure. An \$8m energy efficiency improvement is under way funded by expected energy savings. The \$725k proposed bond issue would pay for a detailed estimate of the cost of renovation would be 40% reimbursed by MSBA. All district members must approve. Bouquillon has appointed a Regional Agreement Task Force (Al Tosti from Arlington) to recommend desirable changes by July. One possibility is to vote/pay proportional to number of students in the member town's high school. He has suggested a "17th town" idea that would make cost to non-member towns based on number of non-member students and thus more equitable. The initial payment on this bond would not come due until FY12. Arlington's total would be about \$725k*(1-.4)/3=\$145k.

BUD 21 LIBRARIES: Library/HumSer SubCom (Franclemont) Proposed the budget as printed. The library will have to apply for a waiver to receive state aid because of the reduction in the books & materials budget. The Director's preference would be to restore this budget. The Assistant Director left & will not be replaced. No hour changes.

VOTED \$1,888,852 net of W&S EF offset. 12-1

BUD 5 INFORMATION TECH: Finances SubCom (Dunn) recommended the budget as printed. VOTED \$491,878 net of W&S EF offset. Unanimous.

BUD 6 COMPTROLLER: Finances SubCom (Dunn) recommended a 1.2 % reduction in line with the Manager's January policy. This would be \$5,000 in telephone expenses. VOTED: \$399,044 net of W&S EF offset. Unanimous

BUD 1 FINANCE COMMITTEE: GenGov SubCom (Howard) recommended the budget as printed. VOTED: \$10,988 Unanimous.

COMMITTEE: Goal is to finish hearings this month. Understand department budgets & correct if necessary. Vote budgets in first half of March.
