VISITORS: Treasurer Steve Gilligan, Treasurer's financial advisors from Boston Advisors Mike Vogelzang, John Peterson

Minutes of 5/18/09 approved as corrected. Unanimous.

ART 65 STABILIZATION FUND: Gilligan introduced his new financial advisors. He provided a handout giving the present value of all 4 of the stabilization funds. He stated that he intends to transfer all stabilization funds currently held & managed by State Street to be held at Fidelity and managed by Boston Advisors. He also plans to convert all funds currently invested in equities into cash equivalents by 7/1/2010. His advisors would like to do this gradually in hopes of recouping some of the value as the market recovers. FinCom members asked numerous questions to clarify this situation. During the subsequent discussion, members expressed concern with leaving any of these funds invested in equities, even for a few months. VOTED to withdraw \$2,742,376 from the Fiscal Stability Fund and apply it to the FY10 budget according to the 5 year plan and to request the Treasurer to keep the stability funds in non-volatile investments. Unanimous.

ART 52 LOCAL OPTION TAXES: Tosti stated that the budget being considered by the Senate includes a local option 2% meals tax worth an estimated \$600k to Arlington. Members discussed whether to accept this tax at the possible detriment to our restaurants compared to surrounding towns. After 2 tie votes, the committee VOTED no action anticipating difficulties at Town Meeting proposing acceptance of a local option proposal which is not yet a statute. 12-4.

ART 61 OPEB: VOTED \$498,313 based on the latest non-contrib budget and no use of Medicare Part D funds. Unanimous. Also after some discussion of just how to do it VOTED to add a part c which would prevent the funds from being invested until the end of FY10 unless approved by votes of the BoS & FinCom. Unanimous. This would keep these funds available for reappropriation at a Special Town Meeting if needed.

ART 42 CAPITAL BUDGET: Foskett corrected his 5/18 handout by deleting the short term interest expense. VOTED \$8,107,764 Unanimous.

W&S EF: Ferrara provided a handout with corrections to he previous recommendation. VOTED \$16,383,255 Expenses to be covered by an increase in fees. Unanimous.

BUD 24 INSURANCE/UNEMPLOYMENT: Tosti said the Manager has been able to reduce his estimate. VOTED \$280,360. Unanimous.

BUD 18b POLICE: VOTED \$5,847,363 with a revised IT charge. Unanimous.

BUD 18c FIRE: VOTED \$5,534,923 also with a revised IT charge. Unanimous.

COA EF: VOTED \$111,133 Exp, \$115,136 Rev as printed in budget book. Unanimous

BUD 1 FINCOM: Voted same as last year with correction for Exc Sect salary \$10,740. Unanimous

BUD 22a HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES At recommendation of SubCom VOTED to increase budget by \$4000 to strengthen inspection service. 13-3.

ART 37, 38, 39 COLLECTIVE BARGAINING: At recommendation of Town Manager VOTED no action since no agreement is in sight. Unanimous.

ART 63 At recommendation of SubCom VOTED to increase the transfer from Lot & Graves to \$71,000. Unanimous.

TRANSFER: VOTED to transfer \$1050 from the Reserve Fund to the ZBA to pay for ads for an unexpected number of hearings. Unanimous.

COMMITTEE: Wrapup dinner on 6/22 at Masonic Temple. RESERVE FUND BALANCE: \$199,800-\$1,050=\$198,750 Peter B Howard 5/28/09
