VISITORS: none

MINUTES of 3/24 & 3/26 approved w/ a correction to 3/26. Unanimous.

W&S EF: PubWorks SubCon(Ferrara) recommended, via the Chair, a \$350k increase to the capital line item and a \$65k increase to the sewer maintenance line item with a corresponding decrease in retained earnings. This request came from the Town Manager's office.

VOTED Expenses \$15,282,575, Revenue \$15,332,667. Unanimous.

ART 54 CAPITAL BUDGET: The CPC Chair, Charlie Foskett, recommended 3 changes to the budget voted on 3/5.

All had been previously discussed w/ the FinCom. He adjusted the figures to reflect the final cost of the rink chiller overrun. He added a new section to make explicit a traditional practice by which the Town Manager may shift unused funds as needed in a given section of the capital budget. He added another new section that details proposed transfers of funds remaining in completed projects to a new project: planning Thompson (& Stratton) renovations. These funds total \$833,687. Next year any funds available from Peirce Field may also go into this account.

VOTED to approve these changes. Unanimous.

At this point Tosti yielded the chair to Foskett. Tosti did not participate in the following discussion.

ART 47 POBs: Foskett reviewed the Treasurer's 2/11 presentation on this article and the FinCom's vote. The Treasurer does not agree with this vote. He provided his recommended (and some supporting material) which would authorize the borrowing as well as the home rule petition. Foskett, the Manager & the Treasurer have discussed this matter but only reached partial agreement. Foskett presented a version of the Treasurer's vote which Foskett had edited to be consistent with the FinCom's vote on 3/17. There was considerable discussion.

VOTED to approve the vote as presented by Foskett. 13-0-1.

At this point Tosti resumed the meeting chair.

BUD 15 ARB The Planning Director requested a \$3k increase in the Crosby School expense budget.

VOTED to approve this request. Unanimous. GenGov SubCon(Howard) to verify this request & veto if necessary.

BUD 18b ComSafe SubCon(Bayer) reported that he has accurate counts of each rank. If this leads to budget savings, he will increase the overtime budget.

ART 19 AFFORDABLE HOUSING TRUST FUND: Patricia Worden sent Tosti a letter (forwarded to FinCom by email) explaining the need for a trust fund to safeguard any funds received from developers earmarked for affordable housing. Tosti reported that O'Brien thinks this is unnecessary. The FinCom declined to reconsider its no action vote taken 3/5.

ART 49 RECLASSIFICATION: VOTED \$13,515. Unanimous.

ART 72 STABILIZATION FUND VOTED to authorize the chair to fill in a number to balance the budget. Unanimous.

ART51: Tosti suggested that any savings in the Manager's budgets be applied to the future collective bargaining article.

VOTED to endorse this idea.

FINCOM REPORT DRAFT: Tosti walked the committee through the hard copy provided by Turkall. Foskett to verify the borrowing rescindings. Several corrections & improvements made. Additional changes needed by Sunday.
 COMMITTEE: Tosti requested subcommittees to let the Comptroller (Cindy Fields) know which line items had been changed. Tosti asked members to carefully review the hardcopy draft of the FinCom report by next Monday. The next meeting will be at 7:30 on the 2nd night of Town Meeting. A proposed wrapup dinner date is 6/11.
