MINUTES of 2/19/03 accepted. Unanimous

GOVERNOR'S BUDGET: Tosti gave a preliminary report on the proposed budget. He believes the reduction for the FY03 cherry sheet will be 5 percent instead of the expected 20 percent. There is uncertainty because of the savings predicted from the substantial reorganization that was proposed at the same time. The House budget is expected in mid-April with a vote in May. Tosti is reworking the budget spreadsheets.

ARTICLE 56 APPROPRIATION/COMMITTEES & COMMISSIONS: Stevens provided a letter explaining their budget and describing the duties of the Conservation Administrator. There have been fewer projects in FY03 than in previous years and thus less income from fees. No change is expected next year. A 10 percent cut would be OK.

VOTED a 10 percent reduction from FY03, \$14,926. Unanimous.

ARTICLE 57 TRANSFER OF FUNDS/CONSERVATION COMMISSION: Sullivan does not know whether the revolving fund that was supposed to be set up last year is in place. Tosti asked him to discuss this with the comptroller since Town Meeting took no action on the transfer of funds from the Receipt Reserve account.

VOTED no action consistent w/ last year's vote. Unanimous

ARTICLE 59E INDEMNIFICATION OF MEDICAL COSTS

VOTED \$9,813 Unanimous.

ARTICLE 56 APPROPRIATION/COMMITTEES & COMMISSIONS: The remaining committee budgets were also voted with 10 percent reductions:

VOTED for Capital Planning Committee: \$450 Unanimous.

VOTED for Commission on Disability: \$450 Unanimous.

VOTED for Recycling Committee: \$1800 Unanimous.

ARTICLE 60 APPROPRIATION/TOWN CELEBRATIONS: Each of the following items was discussed. Larger reductions were proposed, but the majority felt the Town should support these activities at some level.

VOTED for Seasonal Lighting \$2,000, a 33 percent reduction. 8-7.

VOTED for Veterans Day Parade \$5,667, a 33 percent reduction 14-1.

VOTED for Flags on Graves \$3,000, no reduction, a state requirement 12-2.

VOTED for Flaqs on Mass Ave \$0. as proposed by the Manaer. She will put flaqs in the 3 business centers only. Unanimous.

ARTICLE 28, 29 TRASH COLLECTION: Using handouts, Alison and Abbott explained that the first bag would be collected at no extra charge. Additional bags would be cost about \$2.10. They predict \$1 million saving as residents shift to recycling which costs the Town less to dispose of. Members asked many questions. The program costs are not included in the Recycling Committee's projections. There is some doubt whether most households could get by with 1 bag. The Chair requested more information about the operation and success of PAYT programs in other communities.

COMMITTEE: No meeting Monday. Next meeting Wed., 3/5/03. Kneeland to arrange presentation on user charges for fields if possible. He is also to arrange for McClennen to discuss Town building reuse at a subsequent date. Pay and Classification Plan copies provided.
